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## ACTIVITIES OF ORC/HCA IN JULY 2015.

### ❖ CROSS- BORDER CITIZEN'S NETWORK FOR PEACE, RECONCILIATION & HUMAN SECURITY IN BALKAN



Within the project activities in this regional partnership project, Youth Resource Center (ORC) Tuzla continues with the activities on the research "The aspect of human security of youth living in the collective centers, or the "alternative accommodations in B&H". During July, we have dedicated ourselves to desk research, and preparations for field research (focus groups and interviews in collective centers).

Trough the research activities we were focused on two main issues:

- ❖ Which risks/problems, related to the human security, are affecting youth living in the collective centers and alternative accommodations in B&H?
- ❖ What are the risks and difficulties that youth have to face after leaving collective centers and alternative accommodations?

The plan is to maintain 10 focus groups and 18 inerviews during the research. More on these activities can be found in our following newsletters, as well as on our website page:

#### ❖ CREATIVE WORKSHOPS

Youth organization "Svitac" during the month of July continued with their daily activities. Participants were divided into two groups, one group contained children ages 4-7, and their activities were held every day from 11.00 to 13.00, and the other group was made of children age 8+, with their activities being held from 14.00 to 15.30. When summer came group, which contained younger children 4-7, worked intensively on sea, under the sea world with fish, starfish and mermaid collages.

The group also learned how to make flip flops made of paper with shiny decorations, figures made of dough, origami animals and various drawings using watercolors. Goal of this workshop this month was to develop children's imagination and for children to learn how to express their creativity using different materials. In this month there were 25 participants attending creative workshops.



The afternoon group (age 8+) this month learned how to make musical instruments (guitars) made out of the cardboard and recyclable materials. The participants came up with a new team games and the rules for them, the fruit made out of cardboard and construction paper. The group also this month worked through the games on the basis of the grammar of English and German.

Workshops were held at Youth Center Brcko District.

Workshop coordinator was Sanja Radovanovic assisted by Weltwaerts and EVS International volunteers Tamara Wonner and Nicolas Dunai from Germany, John Streatfileda, Isembarda Ryner, Kate Roberts, Sarah Al-Taki and Catriona O 'Sullivan from the UK. The number of participants varied between 25 and 30.

## ❖ WORKSHOP „FUN DAY “



This kind of workshops started up again in the beginning of July because the participants were finally on summer break. Activities were held every Wednesday and Friday from 10.30 to 12.00 in Youth Centre Brdsko Distrikt.

These workshops were intended for children of younger age (8-12). The main aim was for participants to have fun and to socialize through variety of interactive games during this summer.

There were 15 participants. Coordinators of these workshops were international EVS (European Voluntary Service) and volunteers Kate Roberts and Sarah El-Taki.

## ❖ MUSIC WORKSHOPS

### ▶ GUITAR WORKSHOPS

Participants of Guitar workshops continued to work on the etudes, miniatures and duets selected for them in accordance with their capabilities and knowledge of the instrument. These were mostly etudes from the Renaissance, baroque, classical and romantic period but also the etudes of modern character.

### ▶ SAMBA WORKSHOPS

Participants of this workshop this month, in addition to playing the compositions, worked on the practicing themes from the film by James Bond to "Boomwhackers". This has also served as preparation for the summer music camp at Mount Trebevic from 8<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> July 2015, which was attended by 10 volunteers (6 international and 4 local) and 15 participants (young people from the area of Brcko District in the age between 14 and 20). Music workshops for children aged 7-12 were held on Wednesdays in the Youth Center. In July, the children were learning about the various musical genres.



### ▶ ALTERNATIVE CHOIR

In the mid- June alternative choir started with its work. This activity was coordinated by EVS volunteer Isambard Reyner. The number of participants is not yet constant, but those who visited this workshop had the opportunity to familiarize themselves with unusual arrangements of popular punk and rock songs.

## ❖ ENGLISH WORKSHOP "I LOVE ENGLISH"

Participants continued with discussions and pro / cons arguments on three themes (music, film, sport) which were determined by the coordinator. In this way participants practiced pronunciation and informal conversation.

Coordinator of the workshops was an international EVS volunteer from the UK, John Streatfield. Workshops were held on Mondays and Wednesdays from 19: 00-20: 00 h in the Youth Center of Brcko District. There were 6 participants, ages 15+.

## W?! (SPRECHEN-THEMEN- ARGUMENTIEREN) - GERMAN WORKSHOPS

Interactive workshops of the German language were gladly attended and very well planned. For those who really wanted to learn something, this activity was of great benefit. The workshops had six participants, ages 18+. Workshops were held in the Youth Centre on Mondays and Wednesdays from 20: 00-21: 00 hours. Coordinators of these workshops were international volunteers from Germany: Nicolas Zdun and Tamara Wonner. Tamara Wonner and Nicolas Zdun took part in the event "Stammtisch", which was organized by Glossa - a center for the German language in Tuzla. Young people had the opportunity to speak with native speakers of German, and thus expand their vocabulary and improve their existing knowledge of the German language.



## ❖ SPORTS WORKSHOPS

Sports workshops made for children of younger ages, in July continued once a week, every Thursday, 14:00 to 15:30. The number of participants varied from 8-15. Participants were age 8 and up. The workshops were divided into three parts. The first part was doing warm-up exercises, the goal of the second part was exercising motor skills with the ball, and the third part was the most interesting because it contained team-work through ball games, football, dodgeball, etc. Sport workshops for adults Freeletics included exercises to maintain fitness and for strengthening physical abilities. Workshops for adults were held on Tuesdays and Thursdays in the Youth Center from 21: 00-22: 00. There were 5 participants. The coordinator of sports workshops was Nicolas Zdun, international EVS volunteer from Germany.

## ❖ MUSIC CAMP 2015

Youth organization "Svitac" held a music camp on Trebevic from 08. 07. - 15. 07. 2015. The participants attended a series of musical, creative and sports workshops, which were held every day in nature and they had fun playing and socializing and also developing cognitive, social and motor skills with the help of rhythmic musical instrument boomwackers's. At the creative workshops participants worked with materials from the immediate environment and nature, and the sporting activities gave them the opportunity for recreation. The total number of participants in this camp was 25.



Plans for August are to resume all regular workshops of Youth Organization "Svitac" and implementation of projects "Summer Camp" in Greece and "Summer Camps 2015" in Brcko District.

### ❖ ART CROSSING BORDERS

### ❖ PRONI volunteers becoming international coaches

PRONI Centre has had their representative in training for trainers titled "Inclusion LAB II" held in Milcoveni, Romania. This training is the second activity from the project "Inclusion Express" which is financially supported by the Council of Europe through the European Youth Foundation.

The training brought together 25 participants from 18 different countries, and aimed to train youth workers how to organize activities related to the social inclusion of young people as well as how to access their social rights in their local communities. The idea for this training is to contribute to the development of the participants as a trainer / facilitator, as a role through which they will act when they return home. The training is a continuation of the "Mind the Gap" project, held in April in Brcko District in B&H.

PRONI is the only member of Youth Express Network from B&H. PRONI is active member from 2009., and in the last 2 years they are also in the management of the Network. *Youth Express Network is international network headquartered in Strasbourg.* The people working there are social workers, young people, and youth organizations from all over Europe. The network was established in 1993. Youth Express Network uses methods of informal education techniques such as Theatre of the Oppressed, working with youth outdoors, arts in working with youth and mobile courses. In this way, PRONI has strengthened with a new coach in the field of social inclusion of youth which they have once again demonstrated their consistency in the implementation of the mission of their organization.

#### ❖ SPEND YOUR SUMMER DIFFERENT! INVITATION FOR YOUTH FOT YOUTH EXCHANGE

„Don't dream it - be it“ is a joint project of the young people from Croatia, Serbia, and Bosnia and Herzegovina. This project is the result of the last year's successful youth exchange in those three countries named *Connect*. During this exchange a good cooperation was established between Croatian Red Cross-Urban Society Zupanja and organizations YMCA Serbia from Backi Petrovac and PRONI from Brcko.



Young people from those three countries jointly designed the theme and content of exchanges, with the aim of raising the quality of life of young people, in particular for young people with fewer opportunities. PRONI's desire was to empower young people to better dispose resources in their communities, and use them to build their own future and a better quality of life, enabling them to acquire additional skills and knowledge through informal and fun way.

The main theme of the project is healthy life style of the youth. The main objective of this project is the increase of the life quality of youth, in particular youth with fewer opportunities.

The specific objectives of the project are:

1. Acquisition of skills and knowledge in the field of healthy lifestyles (diet, exercise, responsible sexual behavior, non-violent communication),
2. Contribution to the development of responsibility towards the health of young people,
3. Contributing to the development of pro-social attitudes and values in young people, self-esteem and self-confidence
4. Awareness of substance abuse among young people,
5. Intercultural learning and spreading of social networks and mutual support among young people.

Empowering young people to adopt healthy lifestyles is contributing to enhancing the quality of their lives. By adopting the knowledge and skills of health, addiction prevention, reproductive health, quality leisure time, non-violent communication, volunteering as an important selection for Mental Health, the participants become more competent, capable and ready to live a healthier and better quality, but is also encouraging people around you to do the same.

Through formal and informal education young people have the opportunity to learn in an interesting, creative and modern approach enriched with numerous examples and their own experience, which strengthen their life skills such as decision making, problem solving, critical thinking and communication skills. They would like young people to expand their horizons, give them the opportunity to gain new experiences and skills and connect them with other young people, to help them build a network of social support and were they can be each other's support.

PRONI believes that their participation in the project greatly assist in developing healthy lifestyles, tolerance for diversity, encouraging the learning about other cultures. They believe that one of the best ways for social inclusion, strengthening a sense of satisfaction and utility, and acquiring important skills is volunteering, which they want to encourage in the project, which will be promoted in

our communities after the project is completed. In this project, PRONI will work to promote positive and supportive volunteer environment, as well as raising awareness of the value and importance of volunteering, as one of the values of the European Union.

In this project 30 young people will participate (plus 6 leaders): 10 from Croatia +2 leaders, 10 from Serbia + 2 leaders, and 10 from Bosnia and Herzegovina +2 leaders. All participants in the project are of age from ages 18-29.

❖ **PRONI represented Bosnia and Herzegovina at a meeting of young people in the Council of Europe ENTER in 2015.**

From June 30<sup>th</sup> to July 3<sup>rd</sup> 2015. European Centre for Youth of the Council of Europe in Strasbourg offered to young people, especially those who have experienced discrimination, exclusion and violence in their environment, the opportunity for their voices to be heard and to provide solutions for improving their access to social rights.

180 young people, youth workers / ca and representatives / ca local and regional authorities from all over Europe and representatives of PRONI have participated in this year's key meeting. ENTER is a project of the Council of Europe on access to social rights of young people, which aims to support youth work and policy and strategy for young people as a clear response to incidents of exclusion, discrimination and violence that youth often meet in their countries.

The strategic role of this meeting of young people and decision makers from all over Europe is talking about the recommendations of the Ministers of the Council of Europe on access of young people to social rights adopted in January 2015

Throughout the meeting, they discussed how the individual member states are working on the promotion and implementation of these recommendations.



**The objectives of the ENTER meeting:**

- To provide young people with the opportunity to have their voice heard in the Council of Europe
- To introduce participants with the examples of good practice in providing access to socially rights for youth
- To demonstrate youth work and activism as a tool to work with young people in the exercising of social rights
- To consider the needs and possibilities of implementation of the recommendations of Ministers
- To collect information and suggestions for further work of the Council of Europe in the field of working with youth in the field of realization of social rights, independence and social inclusion of young people.
- PRONI Center was represented by their manager for working with youth, branch coordinator of Bijeljina and a volunteer from Brcko who presented the experience and work of PRONI Centre in the field of realization of social rights of young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

ENTER meeting was also the opportunity for the participants to meet with other realities, conditions of good practice and to exchange ideas for further joint work and to learn about the work of the Council of Europe.

## DONORS/CALLS/INVITATIONS

### 1. Public Diplomacy Cultural and Educational Programs

The U.S. Embassy administers a small grants program to support cultural and educational activities in Bosnia and Herzegovina that promote mutual understanding between the people of BiH and the United States. Grants generally range between \$1,000 and \$15,000. Proposals should clearly demonstrate how they will advance the understanding of U.S. culture and values among citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Grant proposals are reviewed on a rolling basis, and proposals should be submitted 3-6 months before the planned event or activity.

### 2. Call for Applications: Robert Bosch Actors of Urban Change 2015-2017

The program addresses actors from the cultural sphere, public administration and the private sector who apply with a draft joint project addressing a particular aspect of urban or community development within their city through cultural activities (e.g. social inclusion, participation, cultural diversity, the responsible use of resources).

**Deadline:** 13 September 2015

#### Program Offers

- At a Local Level:
  - Project grants of up to 5,000 EUR
  - Local project-related and tailor-made support by experts of up to 5,000 EUR
- At an International Level:
  - Workshops and lectures by international experts
  - Peer learning sessions moderated by experienced trainers
  - Financial and content-related support for shadowing internships
  - Reimbursement of all travel expenses and accommodation related to the above mentioned activities.

#### Eligible Countries

Teams can apply from all 28 member states of the EU as well as – Albania, Iceland, Norway, Andorra, Kosovo, Russian Federation, Armenia, Liechtenstein, San Marino, Azerbaijan, Macedonia, Serbia, Belarus, Moldova, Switzerland, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Monaco, Turkey, Georgia, Montenegro, and Ukraine.

### 3. European Youth Foundation – Grants for International Youth Activities

Open to: local, national and international NGOs focused on youth work from Council of Europe member states.

Grant: various types up to 50,000 EUR

The European Youth Foundation (EYF) is a fund established by the Council of Europe to provide financial support for European youth activities. It aims to encourage co-operation amongst young people in Europe by providing financial support to youth activities. It concerns activities, which serve the promotion of peace, understanding and co-operation in a spirit of respect for human rights, democracy, tolerance and solidarity.

The EYF provides financial support to the following types of activity undertaken by youth NGOs or networks, or by other NGOs involved in the areas of youth work relevant to the Council of Europe's youth policies and work:

- educational, social, cultural and humanitarian activities of a European character;
- activities aiming at strengthening peace and co-operation in Europe;
- activities designed to promote closer co-operation and better understanding among young people in Europe, particularly by developing the exchange of information;
- activities intended to stimulate mutual aid in Europe and in the developing countries for cultural, educational and social purposes;
- studies, research and documentation on youth matters.

**The EYF gives NGOs the opportunity to apply for 5 different grant types, each one with a specific purpose, rules and expectations:**

1. **International activity** - including meetings of young people or youth leaders in Europe in order to promote participation and intercultural learning. The EYF will cover up two-thirds of the total cost. **Maximum grant: €20,000.**
2. **Annual work plan** - including a series of activities for the following year(s), international activities, pilot activities and also publication (including web development). These activities would be part of and support your NGO's strategy or action plan for the coming years. **Maximum grant: €50,000.**
3. **Structural grant** - The European Youth Foundation may, on an annual basis, grant international non-governmental youth organisations or networks a contribution to cover part of the general administrative costs involved in running their activities at European level. **Maximum annual grant: €25,000.**
4. **One-off structural grant** - The Foundation may also contribute to the administrative costs of regional networks, in order to help them to establish a European structure. **Maximum one-off grant: €10,000.**
5. **Pilot activity** - is an intervention addressing a specific societal challenge linked to the local context in which it takes place. **Maximum grant: €10,000.**

**Deadline is 01.10.2015. for structural grants for 2016. – 2017. (International NGO and networks)**

**There are no fixed deadlines for pilot project applications, which may be submitted at least three months prior to the beginning of the activity in order to allow a proper assessment.**
