# ORC/HCA ACTIVITIES IN FEBRUARY

## Identify and monitor online threats in social media

The event, which marked the beginning of the implementation of the EU-funded project "Strengthening Civil Society in Bosnia and Herzegovina to Identify and Monitor Online Threats on Social Media", took place on February 24 and 25 at the Ibis Styles Hotel in Sarajevo.



The project brought together young people from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina, their mentors, coordinators and monitors, to identify trends in hate speech and radicalization that lead to violent extremism and to recognize the forms in which such communication occurs in social media.

For this purpose, a web platform will be created on which information will be exchanged and content that brings this issue closer to young people, civil society, the media and institutions. The event also presented an ongoing study on the impact of these trends on young people, especially the vulnerable categories of this population. One of the partners of the project is precisely the Youth Resource Center Tuzla, in front of which the participants were: Slobodan Blagovčanin (mentor), Mirela Biković, Emir Karamujić, Elda Lolić, Lejla Galušić, Dzejla Krdžalić, Amir Havić and Eman-Hanan Pinjić.

## II Regular Assembly of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla

The Second Regular Assembly of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla was held on February 26, 2020 at the Public Institution "Center for Culture". This was a report-election session.

We have chosen a new leadership so that in the next two years, the Speaker of the Assembly will be Selma Omerović from UG "Multi".

The new President of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla is Adi Selman from KBS "Tuzla", and Vice President Asja Dizdarević from "Osmijeh za osmijeh" organization.



In addition to the election of the President and the Vice-President, the Managing Board of the VMGT was elected at the Assembly. Emir Karamujić from our Youth Resource Center will be a member of the Managing Board of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla for 2 years!

Other members of the VMGT Managing Board will be: Amar Kavgić from UG "Multi", Dina

Bajraktarević from Tuzla Open Center, Anamarija Divković from OP "Revolt" and Emira Hamzić from "Tuzla Youth Theater" Association.

In addition to the new leadership, the delegates at the session adopted amendments to the Statute, a new Rulebook on the work of the Assembly, a report on the work of the organization and a plan of work of the Managing Board in the current year. Follow us because we are motivated to work even harder for the youth of the City of Tuzla in 2020!

## Partner Meeting - Peace innovation lab, Črnomelj, Slovenia



In the period from 17th to 20th February in Črnomelj, Slovenia, a partnership project called "Peace Innovation Lab: Youth work in edition" has started. Over the course of 3 days, the partners gathered around the SEEYN network have specified the activities that await us during project implementation. The aim of the project is to use the methodology of social innovations in working with young people from the participating

countries we create activities, opportunities and educations for continued peacebuilding work. Financial support for the project was provided by the European Union.

## KORA 7

M.O.C.A.R.T. network of the Secretariat of the Network of Youth Centers for Animation, Development and Training of the Republika Srpska, Perpetuum mobile - Institute for Youth and Community Development, Banja Luka, with the support of the Ministry of Family, Youth and Sports in the Government of Republika Srpska, organized the Seventh Conference of Youth Work in Republic Srpska.

About 80 participants from Serbia, BiH, Belgium and France participated in the Conference and made their contribution by sharing their personal stories and experiences with us. The theme of this year's KORA 7 was opportunities for young people and the transfer of positive examples from the practice of youth work from the region and the EU.



In addition, the M.O.C.A.R.T. network of the Republic of Srpska hosted a representative of the International Youth Office at the National Agency of Belgium for French Speaking, which is part of the Federal Ministry of Wallonia - Brussels, Mr Thierry Doufour.

Carefully designed program, panel with donors, inspirational speeches by young people under T.A.L.K.S. free speech platforms are only part of the activities presented during the three-day conference. In addition, proposals for cooperation between youth centers at regional, state and local levels were presented.

One of the results and conclusions of the Seventh Youth Work Conference was the program of a study visit by a delegation to represent the Republika Srpska youth sector, and to establish co-operation with the youth sector in Brussels.

The representative of ORC Tuzla at the Seventh Conference of the Republic of Srpska Youth Work was Emir Karamujić.

## #NeLaj – Boris Divković Foundation



The Boris Divković Foundation organizes educational trainings aimed at young representatives of different political parties coming from all over BiH. #NeLaj will train in three cities this year: Sarajevo, Banja Luka, Mostar!

Training for young politicians from Banja Luka was held from 21 to 23 February. The second day of educational training began with a lecture by Emir Karamujić, representative of ORC Tuzla. The topic of the lecture was "How to combat hate

speech on digital platforms", with examples of CAT campaign and a practical workshop for young politicians from Banja Luka.

The series of trainings will be followed by follow up activities, in the form of organizing a gallery of insults and hate speech across BiH cities.

The aim of the project is to educate participants about the consequences of using online platforms negatively and to raise awareness of violent extremism, hate speech and cyber bullying. The main question we want to answer is: Where is the line between hate speech and free speech?

The project is funded by USAID Bosnia and Herzegovina and its implementation is supported by IOM Bosnia and Herzegovina under the BHRI program. #NeLaj project is implemented by Boris Divković Foundation.

## RYCO consultation meeting



Through a project supported by the European Union, RYCO wants to increase opportunities for young people to engage in activities that build mutual understanding and reconciliation in civic, social, educational, cultural and sports fields from the Western Balkans.

**In this regard, RYCO is organizing a local consultation meeting, where young people had the opportunity to express their views on the work of RYCO and what they wanted the future Open Calls to look like. The meeting was held in Brčko, and**

Mirela Biković took part in front of ORC Tuzla.

Regional Office for Youth Cooperation - RYCO believes that young people should play a prominent role when discussing programs that are directly related to them. For this reason, they want to hear their opinion on the types of projects and approaches to intercultural learning that they would like to see in future Open Calls for Proposals.

## REGULAR ORC/HCA TUZLA ACTIVITIES

### Daily workshops



Youth Organization Svitac has continued with daily activities on a regular schedule, the first group of participants from 11: 00-13: 00 ages 4-7, and the second group of participants from 14: 00-15: 30 ages 8+. The younger participants created educational items with the help of local and international volunteers. The group of youngest participants had the opportunity to make various decorations: paper airplanes, roller coaster rides, traffic lights, rattles and paint animals. Like last month, we practiced greetings and words in English of friendship and

tolerance. The participants also continued to practice the alphabet - letters Ć, D, Đ and Dž and learned the letters F, G, H and the words beginning with those letters. At the music workshops they were learning a new song "Ivin voz" and in that workshop they made little rattles. As part of our regular activities, we also had listening to stories: "Priča o gusjenici", "Daleko životinjsko carstvo" and the story of the importance of the "Mali bumbar Hildi". After the story of the animal kingdom, they looked at a short puppet show through which they had the opportunity to see the story's story once again. This month we also paid attention to the hygiene and the pyramid of healthy eating, where we emphasized the importance of maintaining hygiene and healthy eating methods by age-appropriate methods. The second part of the workshop is intended for relaxation, refreshment, yoga, sports and various competitive games. The goal of these activities for children is to develop imagination and to express creativity with materials, and develop motor skills, tolerance and respect, adopt good behavior.

The participants of the second workshop (14: 00-15: 30), for the age of 8+, were valuable in various activities. On Mondays, creative expression, on Tuesdays, participants practiced English and German, on Wednesdays, drawing and reading comics, on Thursdays, socializing with sports activities, social and teambuilding games, and on Fridays continued to work on free creative expression topics. This month, we also hosted an interactive workshop for ages 12+ on "Peer Violence", and through sharing experiences, highlighted this burning problem in



BiH. We talked with the participants about verbal and physical violence at school, but also in the immediate environment, everyday problems and non-violent methods in dealing with verbal and physical abuse. The goal of these activities is for the participants to develop their imagination and to express their creativity, develop motor skills, sense of tolerance, respect for each other and adopt good behavior using various materials. Workshop coordinator was Adin Midžić with the assistance of local, Weltwärts and EVS / ESC international volunteers. All activities are held at the Youth Center of the Brčko District.

## Guitar workshops

Guitar workshop participants continued to work on etudes, techniques, compositions, scales, harmonization and improvisation from the previous period.

## Samba workshops

The participants of this workshop started working on three new ideas ("Byte Bato", "Ken Ripit" and "Oil Wheel"). All three compositions are without electric instruments (Bass and Electric Guitar), with three different tempos. The first, slightly slower tempo, leans on a funky rhythm, the second has a samba on the rhythmic basis, and the third drum and bass.

## ECO Project

Members of the environmental project have continued to plan future activities for 2020. Our team started planning the cultivation of plants and vegetables for the garden by the Sava River as part of the City Gardens project. We are very pleased to be able to support our city and the creative young people who came up with this idea. Tree planting is planned for March when we will have a safe place and nice weather on our side. At the beginning of February, another street action was undertaken to raise funds for the purchase of seedlings and a work plan for environmental presentations in primary and secondary schools.

## Social justice day

On February 20, the Svitac youth organization organized a workshop to mark International Day for Social Justice. The workshop was attended by 13 participants aged 4-6; working method and mode is adjusted to their age. They had the opportunity to listen to a story closely related to the topic, and after that they discussed positive examples from the story. The workshop was held at the premises of the Youth Center Brčko District.



## Mother Language Day

On 21 February 1999, UNESCO declared Mother Language Day. The scroll marked this date with two activities. Participants aged 4-6 years were taught how to say love in Spanish, German, English, Turkish

and Hungarian, and after the discussion adjusted to their age about the various languages in the world, they dyed the worksheet.

Participants aged 15+ also discussed the importance of preserving different languages in the world, and were learning how to say hello in multiple languages. They also had the opportunity to watch a video about the importance and nurture of language, and then work in small groups and write pro-and-counter arguments to the question of whether it would be better for all people in the world to speak only one language. Workshops were held in the premises of Youth Center.

## Orange day

The Svitac Youth Organization was part of an event called "Orange Day" on February 25th. Orange Day is declared by the United Nations and is held every 25th of the month. The aim of this event is to raise awareness and take action to eliminate violence against women and girls. The workshop was led by daily coordinator Adin Midžić, as part of the "UMiD" training for young leaders. The training is organized by the "KULT Youth Development Institute" and is supported by the Embassy of the Kingdom of Sweden in BiH. Orange Day took place simultaneously in 13 local communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Svitac held two workshops. The first workshop was held for the age group of 4 to 6 years. The aim of the workshop was to have the boy and the girl in the couple complete tasks together and help each other. On the creative part of the workshop the task was to draw a present for his buddy. The workshop was attended by 23 participants and was held from 11 am to 1 pm at the premises of the Youth Center of the Brčko District.



The second workshop was attended by 10 participants aged 15 years. At the beginning of the workshop, they watched a short documentary video on violence against women and girls in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Afterwards, the group discussed the types of violence, how to identify violence in their community, and what steps were being taken to prevent it. Finally, they were informed of all safe houses in Bosnia and Herzegovina and SOS hotlines to prevent violence. The workshop was held from 1pm to 2pm, at the premises of the Youth Center of the Brčko District.

All regular workshops of the Svitac Youth Organization are planned for March.

## UMiD trainees highlighted the problem of violence against women and girls in BiH

The KULT Institute for Youth Development has been pointing to the problem of violence against women and girls for years and marks the 25th of the month, Orange Day, a day to combat violence against women and girls. The Institute informs the public in various ways about the presence of the problem, educates young people on ways to prevent violence, and advocates the best solutions to stop or reduce violence against women and girls.



According to available data, every other woman in BiH has been a victim of violence since the age of 15, which is a huge problem and a violation of guaranteed human rights. This is why today the participants of the UMiD Training Institute, Generation 15, celebrated Orange Day in 13 local communities and called on the general public to be more actively involved in solving or preventing this problem. In Ilijaš, young people put up a banner on the main promenade with the banner Stop violence, invited fellow citizens to be informed about the importance of combating violence and to join them in their action. Đenana Šehić was one of the organizers of activities in Ilijaš, she stated that she was satisfied with the response of citizens and volunteer activities. Đenana says that every form of violence is intolerable and that we have to talk about it all the time. She notes that victims often have fear and should not speak about the problem, which is why it is necessary for us as a society to get involved in solving this problem.

Just east of Ilijaš, in Foča, Marija Mališ is a student at the Public Secondary School Center in Foča, also a student of UMiD 15 training, today held an educational class on the topic of violence against women and girls in front of 40 peers.

In addition to Ilijaš and Foča, Orange Day is also celebrated in Brčko, Srebrenik, Kiseljak, Tuzla, Banja Luka, Novi Travnik, Bihać, Žepče, Zenica, Maglaj and Ilidža.

## Young people from 15 communities more willing to think critically

More than 30 young people from 15 local communities in BiH will be more prepared to welcome local elections, as they are trained to critically reflect and analyze political messages. Young people have noted the significant use of negative rhetoric in political speech and the impact of such information on young people and the rest of the population in BiH.

In the period from December 1, 2019, the Institute by January 15, 2020, did a survey on negative speech and rhetoric of division among media politicians, and the results showed that identified politicians in the most read print and electronic media made more than 600 statements in 45 days. In the stated statements, the youth were mentioned only 11 times, exclusively in the context of leaving BiH, and approximately 30% of the statements were generally of a negative tone. Based on the Institute's research and past experience, short-term training for youth has been developed, aimed at empowering young people to think critically about the statements of politicians in public and to understand the impact of negative rhetoric on peacebuilding processes in BiH. The trainings were organized in Mostar and Banja Luka, where more than 30 young people had the opportunity to participate.



During the training, young people created short video clips telling politicians what they should do and what their story should focus on ahead of local elections. Also, upon completion of the training, the best ideas of young people will receive financial and mentoring support to carry out activities in their communities that increase awareness of the importance of critical thinking and the impact of negative rhetoric on people's lives in communities.

The activities were carried out within the framework of the project "Youth Support in Local Communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina" implemented by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), with financial support from the United Kingdom Government.

## UMiDp 3 started: Young politicians ready for more active participation

The KULT Institute for Youth Development has officially enrolled a third generation of trainees for youth politicians. In the coming period, the training will be attended by 23 young politicians from 11 different political parties and from all parts of Bosnia and Herzegovina with the aim of positioning youth issues on the list of current policy priorities in Bosnia and Herzegovina in the future.

Adnan Avdić from Naša Stranka is one of the trainees who emphasized that he has high expectations and believes that it will be fulfilled, because at the very beginning he realized the high level of professionalism and dedication of the organizers and lecturers.

A young woman, Tonina Ibrulj from Ljubuški, a member of the Croatian Democratic Union, has similar thinking. She believes that education is crucial in developing skills for young people, both formally and informally, which is one of the reasons why she chose this training as well.



UMiDp is the Institute's Program for Youth Political Leaders, young people from different political parties and through three five-day training modules acquire knowledge and skills about knowledge of the political system in BiH and its activities, development of political image and political advocacy and negotiation for youth problem solving and needs.

Ekrem Sarajlić from Vitez is the president of the municipal organization SDP in Vitez recently and stresses that he is ready for this responsible function, and is convinced that UMiDp training will help him in this. His training colleague, Miloš Kovačević from Laktaši, is a member of the Democratic Alliance - DEMOS, one of the younger parties in BiH, but as Kovačević points out with experienced individuals and new energy brought in by young people. Although he does not intend to run in local elections, he is ready to put his theoretical knowledge into practice and help achieve the best possible election results.

With this training, the Institute wants to focus young people and empower them to participate actively within their own political parties, but also during and after the election process, so that they can professionally represent the needs of the youth. The first training module was held in Sarajevo, February 19-23. The next module will be held in Mostar during April, and the last, the third module, in Banja Luka during May 2020.

The training is conducted with the support of the Embassy of the Kingdom of Sweden in BiH.

## Memorialization as a form of (not) reconciliation in the community



On February 8-9, the Association for Social Research and Communications (UDIK) organized a lecture entitled "Memorialization as a Form of (Not) Reconciliation in the Community". The lecture was held in Banja Luka and was attended by representatives of the non-governmental sector, representatives of local authorities, associations of victims' families and young activists. Lectures, joint dialogue and exchange of experiences sought to answer many questions: What is the monumental culture in BiH and the region? Does civic memorialization contribute to community reconciliation? Why doesn't BiH have a law on building a monument? Are there controversial monuments in the community and what are they like?

## Marking the anniversaries of suffering

In February activists of the Association for Social Research and Communications (UDIK) attended commemorations on the anniversary of the casualties of Sarajevo civilians in Markale (5.2) and the anniversary of the abduction of civilians in Štrpci (27.2). By issuing a press release and laying wreaths at the sites of remembrance, UDIK sought to remind the public of these anniversaries. Visiting the sites of distress and marking anniversaries is part of UDIK's regular activities throughout the year.

## Apply for a grant from Challenge fund

**The \$ 750,000 Challenge Fund grant** is once again available to businesses with innovative business ideas, products or services from Bosnia and Herzegovina and Sweden. The Fifth Call for Proposals was announced and will be **open until March 24, 2020 by 4 p.m.**

For potential startup users who have been registered for at least six months, a maximum grant of EUR 10,000 is foreseen, while beneficiaries in the mature business entities category up to 250 employees who have been in business for more than two years can count on support in the maximum up to 30,000 EUR. Applicants must also provide a minimum own contribution of 50% of the total value of the proposed project, the realization of which may not exceed a year.

All received applications will be evaluated according to three basic criteria - innovation, feasibility and sustainability of the business idea and social benefit.

Applications must be submitted solely in electronic form on the website [www.c2c.ba](http://www.c2c.ba) in accordance with the instructions contained in the Applicant's Guide / Guidelines. This document is an integral part of the Application Pack which you can download at [this link](#).

The Challenge Fund was established as part of the Challenge to Change project, which is financially supported by the Swedish Agency for International Development and Cooperation / Sida / and implemented over four years by the Sarajevo Regional Development Agency SERDA and the Republika Srpska Development Agency (RARS). The project partner is the region of Ostergotland, Eastern Sweden.

This is the last call planned within the project. Within the previous 4 calls for proposals from the Challenge Fund, 2,074 applicants have applied. So far, 110 beneficiaries have been contracted and the grant awarded is EUR 2,500,866. Signing of a contract with 38 other beneficiaries is under way and will be awarded around EUR 844,000 in grants.
