We present to you our new member: Ammar: “My road, of an activist, started much earlier, while I was, still, in kindergarten”.

Ammar Grabić is a twenty years old student, he studies at the Electrical Engineering Faculty, Tuzla University, and lives in Gradacac.

He is, also, a young journalist, an activist, folk/ethnic music dancer and a fan of music and dance. His passions are travelling, socializing with his friends and meeting new friends.

Ammar’s greatest priorities in life, as he says, are his family, then close friends and then education in every form!

“I do not have a special hobby, but I fill my free time with activism and volunteering. Therefore, I do not have much time for other things.”



How your start in activism looked like?

“I believe my road of an activist started much earlier, while I was still in kindergarten. Why? I see activism as a personal contribution to the community and the engagement in any form - culture, sport, art, and protection of nature or promotional activities. When it comes to all the events, I was involved in, during my previous life path, I tried to give my best, so the others could be better too. My “serious” story started in the secondary school, more precisely in February 2017. As part of my regular school activities, my class was supposed to select a problem in our town and offer suggestions for its solution. By observing our local community, we noticed the problem of how young people spend their free time in decadent places, such as coffee shops or betting facilities. That is how the project named “Volunteering towards progress” was created.

We, gradually, started involving the entire community, primarily authorized local services, the media and, also, the citizens. Based on that, the doors for further activities opened up for me. I attended the training “Learn, Think and Act”, implemented by the Institute for the development of youth ‘KULT’, and, now, I can, proudly, say that I am a certified youth leader. The result of this was the initiative “Clean

environment, healthy local community!” which we implemented in cooperation with the local ‘KULT’ association. I see this as a key move, the breaking point in my commitment to further engagements. After this, many other projects followed. At the moment, I am active in the BiH Youth News Association, where I am also the member of the Committee Board and the Coordinator of the youth magazine “Karika” (“Links”). I am also the member of the Committee Board in the Tuzla Canton Youth Council and the member of my Faculty’s Students’ Council.

Could you name one of the projects/ seminars/ exchanges you participated in or organized, that will remain as a special memory to you?

As I mentioned before, there are many things that amazed me, but I would put **UMiD** to the first place. A yearlong training which thought me the necessary secrets important for the youth activism, I still use in my daily activities and work. Among other things, I learned to translate and be a part of a team, to create projects, to manage resources in a responsible manner and justify all of it.

Informal vs formal education?

I do not make a difference between the two ways of organizing education, because I find important that what is being covered and done is the top quality work, not just to meeting formal requirements. This is why I, as the first step, find the information about the specific training and ask myself if it is the right one for me. But, if I would have to choose, I’d choose the informal education due to its spontaneity, innovative approach and originality.

Ammar, recently, has started his engagement in the Tuzla Youth Resource Centre. His expectations from the CAT and ORC Tuzla, as he says, are great, as it is a new challenge for him, original in every sense. As such, he has become a recognizable brand in our surrounding and work.

THE HCA/ORC PLANS FOR JUNE 2020

- The launch of the new CAT cycle – The Citizens against Terrorism. As part of this cycle, during the next six months, we plan to do the following: Digital Academy for Youth about online activism; Training for youth from Prijedor, Bijeljina and Mostar about street campaigns, filming TV shows on RTV7, filming a documentary about Mufti Mustafa Kurt, conference for the youth about digital and youth activism and many other activities you will be duly informed about.
- The Activities, planned in the scope of the ALF BiH Network, and postponed due to COVID 10, will be held in the forthcoming period. Primarily, those will be promotional activities, webinars, but also the preparations for the BiH **ALD** Assembly.



Rendering technical, administrative and advisory support to the youth campaign in BiH: **"#yourvoicematters"**. "This campaign represents a kind of reaction to the percentage of the voter turnout at the 2028 elections, it is non-party affiliated, oriented to positive rhetoric and modern ways of communication and marketing."

The campaign, includes, so far, about 200 young people from all over BiH, as well as the entire region, who are aware of the critical situation and are willing to do something about it. We will issue more information about the campaign activities in the forthcoming period.

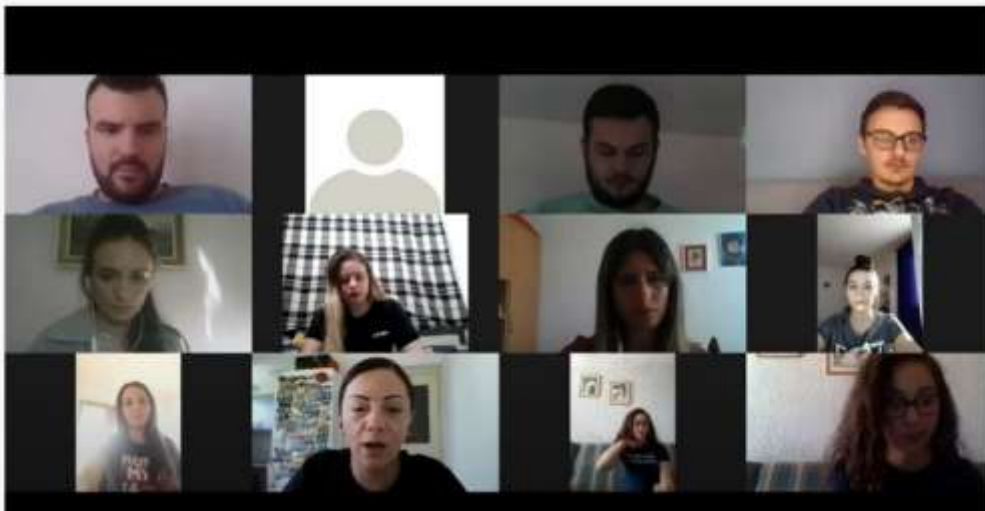

"You Can – Youth Can; Community Focused Youth Leadership

The project „You Can – Youth Can; Community Focused Youth Leadership“ is being implemented in the cooperation with the Agency 'Cerebra' from Banja Luka, thanks to the support of the Bosnia and Herzegovina Resilience Initiative (BHRI), implemented by The International Organization for Migrations (IOM). The first two project modules were held at the beginning of this year. The third and fourth project modules were implemented by using the Zoom application. The youth from Srbac, acquired new knowledges about project management, processes of the participation of youth in the decision making process, as well as, about mobility. The project is being implemented, not only in Srbac, but also in Celinac, Kotor Varos, Knezevo and Banja Luka.

On May 27, 2020, an agreement was signed with the Foundation "Mozaik", for the project "I love Srbac". The project is about touristic promotion of Srbac, by setting up 3D posters, at several locations in the city, with the aim to point out the touristic specifics and to contribute to the attractiveness of the local community. Improvement of human rights in the BiH economy sector



As opposed to other sorts of volunteering activities, we rarely get in contact with the corporate volunteering, simply because such stories remain untold. Even though, there are examples of corporate volunteering in BiH, due to non-existent systemic support to the development of this form of volunteering and promotion of good practices, the companies sometimes are not even aware of their own contribution to the development of their communities. This is why **The Institute for Development of Youth KULT** has launched an online platform volontiraj.ba meant for systemic support and promotion of

corporate volunteering.

The corporate volunteering is a kind of social engagement planned, organized and implemented by a company's employees, which is approved and encouraged by the company's management. As part of those volunteering activities, the employees spend one or more regular working days doing volunteer work, intended to improve the wellbeing of the community and society. The employers treat those days as regular working days, not as days off, and without reducing payments. This way, the companies show social responsibility and get to know better the environment they do their business in.

The volontiraj.ba platform enables the associations to present their current projects in which they need help of the corporate volunteers, while the companies, in accordance with their knowledge and abilities, can give them support and, in such way, show their social responsibility and care for the community.

The registration is free of charge, for both the associations and companies.

The volontiraj.ba platform has been created, in the scope of the initiative "Improvement of Human Rights in Economy Sector in BiH", implemented by the Institute for the Development of Youth KULT, in the cooperation with the Association of employers in FBiH, and the support of the European Union.

20.000 BAM has been collected as support to the youth initiatives

The Institute for the Development of Youth KULT signed contracts with the associations "Menssana" from Sarajevo, "Seize the day – Carpe diem" from Ilijas and "Green team" from Novi Grad, collecting almost 20.000 BAM, as support to the youth initiatives. The signing of the contracts was held online, due to the still active measures undertaken in order to stop the spreading of the corona virus pandemics.



The Association for the protection of mental health "Menssana, through the project "Mental Health in the Frame" wishes to help adolescents overcome crisis of this developmental phase. The President of the Association, Remzija Setic, says that they have a good support system, but the parents and the professionals who work with young people, very often, are not informed about the possibilities they can reach out to. They will, through their initiative,

produce a film and present how the developmental crisis of the adolescents looks like and how it influences their life, school, family and society. The aim is to inform the public, especially the professionals who work with young people, in particular in educational and social environments.

Mirela Kurtovic from the Youth Organization “Seize the day – Carpe diem” says their initiative will be implemented in two more communities, apart from Ilijas, namely, Foca and Gorazde. The aim of their initiative is to contribute to the increase of consciousness about the importance of recycling, but also responsible behavior and attitude towards life environment. They found that our citizens overuse paper and plastics, throw it away, as garbage, in an inappropriate manner, making the process of recycling more difficult. In the cooperation with elementary and secondary schools, but also with youth organizations, they intend to educate young people about the ways of recycling and motivate them to treat their living environment in a responsible manner. They will put containers for selective removal of garbage, in order to speed up and make the process of recycling easier.

The “Green team” from Novi Grad will, also, care about the living environment. However, apart from this, they intend to educate young people about the process of public discussion and starting initiatives with the authorized decision makers. According to their research, conducted over the past 5 years, not a single initiative was sent to the Novi Grad Municipal Assembly, as there were no proper resources. By giving space to young people, for which they have already gotten permission from the local authorities, they will enable networking among the young people and creation of new ideas. With proper education, the young will learn how to address their needs and send initiatives to the authorized local decision makers. Mario Crnkovic, the President of the Association, adds that they, through each of their activities, simply must introduce the care of the living environment. This time, it will be the same, as the space for the young will be “eco-friendly” and will be named Eco corner.

The Institute for the Development of Youth KULT, is proud of their young activists, despite of the problems that surround us, lately, as they found the energy and the will to continue to develop and improve their local communities. The Embassy of Sweden in BiH supports the Institute in the implementation of those initiatives.

The initiative #giftstoeducation has been continued during May



The Institute for Development of Youth KULT, in the cooperation with about 20 local partners, has continued their initiative #giftstoeducation, in May. Thanks to the support of the Embassy of Sweden in BiH, 180 educational equipment devices have been collected. With the support of other donors and partners, the Institute has gotten about 70 more educational equipment devices.

The employees of the Institute, during May, visited Bileca, Novi Grad and Buzim, and in the following days the rest of the equipment will be sent to the addresses of students from economically disadvantaged families. This activity will be implemented in 20 more communities across BiH, as well.

The initiative #giftstodecuctio in numbers:

- More than 750 enquiries, along with equipment, arrived to the addresses of the Institute and local partners;
- More than 600 equipment devices have been sent to 26 local communities in BiH;
- 22 locations of delivery have been set up for takeover of the equipment;
- The value of the donated equipment is over 200.000 BAM.

Everybody has the right to education and this is why all students ought to have technical equipment in order to be able to follow online classes. The donated equipment remains as private ownership of the students, in order to help them learn new school lessons when they go back to schools, and on the other hand to improve their IT literacy.

Daily workshops



The Youth Organization „Firefly“ has continued with their daily online activities, according to the previously set schedule – the first group of participants of 4 to 7 years of age, from 11:00 to 13:00, the second group of participants of 8 + years of age, from 14:00 to 15:30. After the Government of Brcko District has declared the emergency situation, the Youth Organization „Firefly“ postponed all their activities in the Brcko District Youth Center, with the groups of participants, as a preventive measure against the corona virus spread, due to temporary closure of elementary and secondary schools, as well as, higher education institutions.

After the authorities passed this decision, we quickly set up online workshops, adjusted to the age of the participants, with the help of local and international volunteers. This month, they learned to make hedgehogs and dogs using paper, butterflies and flowers, various forms made of dough, which they later painted with water colors. They, also, continued to write and draw numbers, from one to ten, and draw basic geometrical forms. They continued to practice alphabet, practice writing the letter Lj and learned to write letters M, N and Nj, as well as words that start with those letters. They, also, drew things the names of which start with a certain letter. At music workshops, they worked on a computer program „Music lab“, which is adjusted for their age, and for the creative development of the sense and talent for music. They, also, learned the song about hygiene. As in the previous months, the „Firefly“, in the scope of their regular activities, worked on the topic of hygiene and paid special attention to it. The aim of those activities, just as previously, is developing children's imagination by using various materials with which they can express their creativity, develop motoric abilities, feeling of tolerance and respect towards others and learn appropriate social behavior.



The participants of the second workshop (14:00 – 15:30), for the ages of 8 +, joined various activities. During this month, we worked on discussion about hobbies / collecting various items, literature and what they read at the moment. We asked them to show us how they feel, by sending us a gif and what the first thing, they will do with their parents, will be, after the isolation period ends. This month, we also started a mini online project, in which each student says “Freedom is expensive” in a language they choose. The aim of it is to draw attention to the fact that we are, often, not aware what our freedom means to us and that we, often, forget little things which make our lives prettier and fuller. The coordinator of the workshops was Adin Midzic, with the assistance of local, Weltwärts and **EVS/ESC** international volunteers. All activities were implemented online.

Guitar workshops

The guitar workshops participants have continued with online activities. At the moment, we work with each participant for an hour, twice a week, while the communication is maintained throughout a week. Videos shared on the Youth Organization “Firefly” official Facebook page are as follows: “Biljana platno beleše”, Prelude (D. Bogdanović), Etidea broj 1 (Leo Brouwer) i Semplice (Carlo Domeiconi).

Samba workshops

The participants of this workshop have shifted to an online model of work. The activities included preparation, reviews and share of short educational videos on the group’s Facebook page. The videos have been produced by the German-French ARTE TV. Free to watch and share, they are educational and fun to watch. They cover topics such as: procrastination, artificial intelligence, pop culture, sub-culture, photography and music. The students were, also, motivated to, by watching an educational short video, make bats, using items from their closest surrounding.

The International Family Day

The Youth Organization “Firefly”, on May 15, marked the International Family Day, through online workshop for the participants of 4 to 7 and 13 years of age. In the video, filmed by our volunteer Zorana, we read the poem “Home” and sent the message about the importance of family in our lives. The aim of this activity was to develop the ability of perception, creativity and imagination, as well, as to cherish family relationships. The students, then, drew pictures of their families and sent them to us.



The 15 + years of age group sent their motivational messages about the importance of a family and what their families mean to them.

The World Culture Diversity Day for Dialogue and Development

In November 2001, the UNESCO General Assembly adopted the Declaration on Cultural Diversity and pronounced May 21 as the World Cultural Diversity Day for Dialogue and Development. The cultural diversity is supposed to be the starting force, the impetus for the development based on tolerance, mutual respect, understanding and acceptance. The Youth Organization „Firefly“, marked this day through the online workshop, with participants of 4 to 7 and 15 + years of age. We talked to our young friends about interesting information and differences between Bosnia and Herzegovina and Great Britain. The aim was to try to introduce them to different cultures and norms. The 15 + group of participants sent their messages about countries they wish to travel to, and the reasons why they are attracted by that particular culture.

As being different, we are also similar, as we are far apart, we are so close to each other!

ECO – project

We are in contact with the Eco team, on regular basis, through social networks. However, due to the current situation, the group work and gatherings in large groups were not possible. All activities planned for the reporting period have been postponed and will be held after the restrictions are no longer in force. The Youth Organization „Firefly “members plan to continue their activities in June (online and, we hope, also, in the Youth Centre, as well).



INFORMATION / DONORS / INVITATIONS

Youth4Regions- The Program for Aspiring Journalists



Applications deadline: July 13, 2020

Youth4Regions is the European Commission program which helps the students of journalism to discover what the EU does in their region.

Advantages

- Trainings on journalism and the EU regional politics,
- Chance for mentorship by the established journalists from your country,
- Working, side by side, with renowned journalists, during the EU Regions Week,
- Visit media EU headquarters for the EU affairs and institutions,
- Unique opportunity to cooperate, as a journalist, in the European Commission reporting travels to the member states, and
- Accommodation and travel expenses covered by the European Commission

Requirements?

- You are interested in the EU regional politics in your region,
- Educational background in journalism (student or 2 years of experience),
- Citizen of the EU or a neighboring country, age 18 to 30, and
- Availability between October 11 – 16, 2020

Criteria

The criteria for application:

- The EU citizenship or the citizenship of a neighboring country, age 18 – 30, and a true interest in journalism shown through studies and / or working experience. The applications of former participants will not be accepted.
- Candidate countries for the EU membership (Albania, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Turkey), potential membership candidates (Bosnia and Herzegovina and Kosovo) and the ENI countries (European Neighborhood Instrument) (Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Palestine, Syria and Tunisia, as well as, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine),
- Only the candidates who are at least 2 years short of graduating journalism (counting from the application deadline) can meet the criteria,
- You must send a short article (400 – 1000 words) or a short video report (2 – 3 minutes) or the Cohesion Fund. You can choose the topic.
- The Commission covers travel and accommodation expenses. Most meals are covered too, also during the program in October.

THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN PROJECT GRANTS

The Government of Japan started the aid program named “Grass Roots Projects (GAGP)”, for the first time, in 1989, as an addition to the Government of Japan’s General Aid Program. Since 1996, over 180 projects, value of which is about 10 million Euros / 19 million BAM, have been implemented in Bosnia and Herzegovina, as part of the GAGP program.

Even though, the aim of both concepts is to render help to developing countries, in order to help them meet basic human needs and resolve social and economic challenges, the GAGP is focused on support to local communities, namely, directly, to the inhabitants.

Within the scope of the GAGP, the projects grants are given to public institutions (municipalities and municipal public companies), elementary schools, health care centers or civil society organizations which implement relatively small projects.

Priorities

Within the scope of the GAGP program, Japan supports a wide spectrum of projects, based on basic human needs, as well, as those based on safety issues. In Bosnia and Herzegovina, most projects, which have been implemented, as part of the GAGP program, are in the following areas:

- Aid to demining activities
- Public health
- Education
- Social protection
- Rural development

Applicants:

The acceptable applicants are: public institutions (municipalities or municipal companies), elementary schools, health care centers, and local and international civil society organizations.

Unacceptable applicants are: physical persons (individuals), central government organizations (acceptable only in specific cases), kindergartens, research institutes, high education institutions, hospitals, political organizations, religious institutions.

Grant

The GAGP finances the construction and/or purchase of equipment and/or material. All proposed materials, equipment and services must be purchased from local companies.

The grants, exclusively, cover the purchase expenses of goods/services, without VAT.

The administrative and operational expenses are not acceptable.

The highest amount of available means, per project, is 10 million JPY (close to 80,000.00 Euros or 156,000.00 BAM). The exception are the projects of helping the demining activities, the amount for which, can be higher than 10 million JPY.

The GAGP will not approve financial support for projects related to cultural and sport events, activities related to business or activities related to religion.

Submitting applications and the procedures which follows it:

The application delivery

The application is filled in local or English language, and delivered via mail to the Embassy address: Bistrik 9, 71 0000 Sarajevo. The application can be submitted throughout the year.

Review and approval

After the application is received, the Embassy of Japan reviews the aim, expenses and the expected social and economic positive impact of the project. The Embassy will make a pre-selection of all projects taken into consideration, giving advantage to those which meet the goals of the GAGP, while the



Embassy personnel will visit the potential project location. The Embassy will, then, send the selection proposal to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, which is the ultimate institution that approves the projects.

Grant Contract (G/C)

Upon the final approval, the Embassy of Japan and the organization which receives the financial support will sign a contract (G/C) which will include its name, aim and project content, the name of the organization which receives the support, the amount of funds which will be enabled, through the GAGP, and the articles on proper spending of the financial means.

Spending the expenses

Upon this, the grant user will sign a purchase contract (P/C) for the goods and/or services, with the delivery company. The Embassy will review the P/C (or poof/invoice), in order to establish if it is appropriate.

Generally, the duration of the project (time needed for purchase of goods and/or services) should be less than a year.

Reporting

The Embassy will ask the GAGP grant user to prepare and deliver the report on the project status, twice, in case it is a standard project. In case the scope of the project is larger, the number of required reports will be bigger. The Embassy personnel can visit the project location, in order to make sure that the funds are used for the approved purpose.

Apply to join the online course: Digital editing of photos and videos

The Northwestern University invites the interested candidates, from all over the world, to join the free online course about digital editing of photographs and videos.

TOPIC:

Digital editing of photos and videos

DESCRIPTION:

Free of charge, online course lasting 33 hours, it offers a chance to participants to learn basic principles and tools used in editing photos and videos, as well as the way of using them to resolve practical issues in the areas of trade or science. The course lessons are given by Professor Aggelos K. Katsaggelosa.

CONDITIONS:

Candidates from all over the world can apply to join the course. High level of English language knowledge is necessary.

HOW TO APPLY
