ORC/HCA ACTIVITIES IN NOVEMBER 2020

#Quick answer 2020 - #Sjašite

The "Quick Response" military exercise has been conducted in BiH since 2010. As part of the #sjašite campaign, we asked young people for a different Quick Response - in order to maintain peace and stability, we need to respond quickly:

- How many ballots can you put on the ballot for local elections in order for your ballot to be valid?
- Which of those seeking your vote has a youth program and where can we see it?
- Who is warming the chair in the Parliamentary Assembly of BiH since 1996, and who will have references after leaving politics to continue his career under a tent with a microphone?
- Who and how elects the mayor of Sarajevo, when and how do you elect?



The quiz in Sarajevo was held differently from most pre-election rallies - there were twenty of us, we wore masks, we did not incite anyone to hate, we did not promise NATO membership and we reminded young people that municipal councilors and mayors certainly have nothing to do with it. By the way, we remind you:

To find out what councilors, mayors and mayors can really do, and what they dream about while angrily waving their hands at pre-election rallies - read the entity laws on local self-government. Voting in elections means choosing the person who will be your channel of communication, action and work in the local government - but also holding that person accountable for the vote he or she received during the four-year term.

Slobodan Blagovčanin, an activist of the Sjašite campaign, said that it was important especially for young people to be aware of the capacities of their forces in the election process.

"Although the turnout of young people in the elections in Bosnia and Herzegovina is not dramatically low, but average - we in our country always need more than average. It is important for young people to be reminded how to vote properly, to look at who offers what programs, to be reminded of what they have lived so far and what they want to live, if they want to live in this country at all. In seven days, we will vote, vote, decide and order - Get off! "

11. ALF BiH Network Meeting in BiH

In Vitez, in the period from 5 to 7 November 2020, the annual meeting of ALF Network members and the Electoral Assembly for new members of the Board of Directors was held. The meeting was attended by a total of 20 ALF BiH members. Due to the situation with the COVID pandemic, 8 participants attended the meeting in person, while 12 of them attended through the ZOOM application. The topics of this year's meeting were:

1. Report on the work of the office in the previous period and planned activities
 2. Report to the participants on who received funds for projects from the ALF BiH, at the invitation of the ALF
 3. Discussion
 4. Preparations for voting for new board members
 5. Election of New Board Members
 6. miscellaneous
1. Miralem Tursinović informed the members about the work of the office in the previous period. Due to the COVID pandemic, most activities were held online, while participation in the Sarajevo Winter and the Mediterranean ALF Forum in Šibenik were canceled. The conclusion of the participants was that the report should be submitted in writing.
 2. Miralem Tursinović informed the participants that 4 members applied for the call for projects this year, and that only one, a member that was deleted from the network last year due to inactivity - Humanity in Action - received funds for the project, which it did not she was right. The conclusion of the participants was to send a letter to the General Secretariat in this issue, and to also contact the organization Humanity in Action (HIA) Sarajevo.



3. During the discussion, it was pointed out that communication between the members is still very weak, both in person and through the mailing list. Ibrahim Soahić pointed out that he sent the Platform for Cooperation with the International Community to the list, but that there was no response. The members also requested a report from the ALF Board for the past period, as it was not available.
4. Coordinator Miralem Tursinović explained that 18 organizations have so far submitted proposals for board members. Existing board members whose term of office has expired:

 3. Boris Balta – Magic Factory Tuzla

Ivan Sajevic 's mandate lasts until November 2021.

Cedomir Glavas - Odisej Bratunac sent a letter that due to his illness he can no longer perform his function, and that his organization is no longer working.

A total of 18 members submitted candidacies for board members: 14 of them agreed to re-elect old members.

Two members - Our Children Zenica and SEEYN Sarajevo, due to the inability to attend the meeting online, gave the main office the authority to vote for the candidates on their behalf.

The new proposals are:

5. During the voting, there were differences of opinion. Although 50% + one member was present at the beginning of the assembly, according to the Agreement on Cooperation, after various proposals (that all candidates, 10 of them be elected, Ibrahim spahić withdrew his candidacy and nominated Enisa Raković from the vote of woman Bihać, and pointed out that it is not right that there are two members of the Board from Tuzla, to which Vehid Šehić from FGT reacted and withdrew his candidacy). At all this, three ALF members left the meeting, so we were left without a quorum. However, the rest of the members chose for new / old members:

„A copy is valid too“ camp realized on Boračko lake

On the sunlit Boracko Lake, in the period from 3 to 6 August, the Association of High School Students in Bosnia and Herzegovina with the support of the Institute for Youth Development KULT and the Embassy of the Kingdom of Sweden in Bosnia and Herzegovina, realized the camp "I copy is worth" in 2020 and thus marked another most beautiful story this summer!

This educational camp gathered a total of 45 participants - high school students, who had the opportunity to work with trainers, learn and express their views on various topics. Of course, the focus of our camp was to prepare youth facilitators to conduct research in 28 different local communities. During these four days of the camp, participants had the opportunity to learn about advocacy initiatives, the history of the initiative "A copy is valid too", research and implementation, focus groups, conducting interviews and similar topics.



But the most beautiful story of this summer does not end just like that, but extends to both autumn and winter! Our activities continue, so our participants, trained facilitators from 28 local communities, will conduct research on the implementation and success of the initiative "A copy is valid too" in their local communities. After examining the attitudes of high school students on this topic, a document will be

created that will be available to the public entitled "Information on the implementation and success of the initiative" A copy is valid. What makes us most happy is that, after the formed document, we start advocating the implementation of the initiative at the Universities in the Republic of Srpska, in East Sarajevo and Banja Luka.

I'm not clicking into the blank

Media content is a significant part of young people's lives and has a strong influence on shaping their attitudes and decisions. However, high school students rarely have the opportunity to be educated in the field of media and information literacy, which is just as important today as classical literacy. The project I do not click into the blank is intended for them and seeks to increase the level of media literacy high school students in BiH.

As part of the project, we hung out with high school students in several cities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, where they held 15 workshops on media literacy. The workshops were held in cooperation with local ASuBiH teams and high school students throughout BiH. At the workshops, we talked about the media, social networks, fake news, memes, spam, online scams, but also about how to become an online detective.



The workshops were led by teams consisting of a peer coach and one person from the "Disclosure" editorial office, ie UG "Why not".

The goal of the training was to create competent trainers who will effectively transfer the knowledge and experience gained during the training to the workshop participants.

When you are silent, #WeAsk!

On Tuesday, 11/17/2020 year, the Association of High School Students in Bosnia and Herzegovina marked the International Day of High School Students!

The International Day of High School Students is marked in memory of the student protests that took place in Prague on November 17, 1939. year, where students protested against the Nazi occupation, and were shot without trial. This year marks the 81st anniversary of their suffering.

With the support of high school students throughout Bosnia, this year we decided to focus on the topic of youth participation in decision-making processes. Although this year's situation due to the COVID-19 pandemic made our ability to hold activities a little more difficult, we did our best to make the public hear the persistent voice of high school students this year as well. We used the #PitamoSe campaign, which was based on social networks, to interact with our audience, which allowed us to clearly see the problems that stand out in local communities.

The campaign started on the day of the pre-election silence (November 14), and with its help, we singled out 13 units that we want to be asked about:

- space for young people
- youth strategy
- budget for young people
- the youth officer
- content for young people
- opportunities for young people
- youth participation
- more adequate enrollment policies
- adequate transportation to school
- support for non-formal education
- functional online teaching
- abolishing segregation in schools
- better status of high school students

We tried to present this very serious problem as interestingly as possible on our social networks, so we used the activity "Who am I?" to show different stories of young people affected by this problem, and we also created an instagram filter that connected high school students throughout Bosnia and thus celebrated together. Other activities consisted of promoting a poster with prominent requirements, and pasting it on the info boards of local communities and sending letters to the media with a prominent request that corresponds to the problems of the local community. Our message to young people is to demand that they ask themselves about the things that concern them, and to take matters into their own hands and be the voice of change.

All the income that was collected, and it is 3015.75 KM in question, was paid into the bank account for Minja's treatment.

Daily workshops

The youth organization Svitac continued with daily interactive and online activities. Younger participants did creative and educational things in age-appropriate workshops, with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they did: a puppet show, wooden stick houses, the solar system and paper planets. They watched video projections of stories and fairy tales, and cartoons with messages about friendship: Pinocchio, Sponge Bob, Tom and Jerry. They continued with the alphabet and so far they have learned to write the letters I, J, L, Lj, G and words that start with those letters (this month also in Turkish), and have drawn concepts that start with a certain letter. At the music workshops, they studied and rehearsed the songs "Duck School", a Turkish lullaby and recorded a video with the song "Valley of the Mummies". All the songs are very demanding and consist of several verses. In the English language workshops, they worked time in class (3, 6, 9 and 12 pm/am), in the garden, in the garden, my living room and words that are thematically related to Halloween. Our youngest participants also practiced writing numbers. As in previous months, Svitac worked intensively on the topic of hygiene as part of his regular activities and paid special attention to it. The goal of these activities, as before, is for children to develop imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior.

Age 13+ participated in online workshops on the topics: what high school education offers us, how emotions affect sober decision-making, healthy eating and which social networks are used to achieve goals (school and leisure).

In English and German workshops, they paid attention to grammar and more complex sentences using suggestions for movement, searching for objects through four cases, and practiced past tense verbs and sentence construction. In addition, they practiced daily communication and worked on projects and presentations for the school.

The coordinator of the workshops was Adin Midžić with the assistance of local and EVS / ESC international volunteers.

Guitar workshops

Participants worked on new ideas. The first is a purely rhythmic piece without guitar and bass. It consists of two measures. It starts with three bars in 7/8, followed by one bar in 4/4 at a fast pace. Working title - "ABCD".

The second includes bass and electric guitar at a slower tempo. The pace is very slow, so it is a challenge for the participants to stay in pace. Working title - "Instrument".



Samba workshops

Participants continued to work on songs, etudes and compositions such as: "Two etudes in A minor" (F. Sor), "Hotel California" - (Eagles), "Student Circle", "Song" J. Jovičić, "Rain falls grass grows", "Autumn" (V. Stojanov), "Kolisanka" (J. Powortzniak), "Old McDonald" and "Prvi waltz" (J. Powortzniak), etudes No XI-XII and XIII Estudios Sencilos "(Lea Brouwera)," Prelude No. 1 "(H. Villa-Lobos) and" Capricho Arabe "(F. Tarrega).

Halloween 2020

Due to the limited number of participants and in order to respect all epidemiological measures, Halloween this year took place during the day in several groups. Participants had the opportunity to come in costumes, participate in various games, face painting, fun activities and enjoy snacks and refreshments. Children who did not have costumes had the opportunity to have fun painting their faces done by international volunteers.



International Day of Tolerance

The youth organization Svitac marked the International Day for Tolerance with an online workshop. Participants aged 4-6 watched the animated video "My Friend Isabel" in English, which was translated into B / H / S languages with the theme of tolerance and how important it is to respect diversity.

We had an online discussion with group 13+ and talked about the word 'tolerance' and what it means to them personally. Our message is to advocate for the importance of peaceful coexistence and acceptance and respect for others.



International Day against Fascism and Anti-Semitism

November 8 marks the 82nd anniversary of the 'Kristallnacht' pogrom in Germany and Austria. This was the "Night of Broken Glass - Crystal Night" which in 1938 left more than 250 devastated synagogues, over 7,000 destroyed Jewish-owned companies, over 30,000 Jews imprisoned in concentration camps. Hatred spread uncontrollably, and three years later the world saw the Holocaust. Today we remember those horrors and say #NeverAgain #NeverMore.

We use this time as a reminder, that fascism and hatred are still among us. The youth organization Svitac marked this day with a group of young people from the Brcko District, who spoke about the power of poetry. We encouraged them to speak loudly and send a strong message against fascism. Portions of the text in the video are taken from the web magazine "I am not a silent poet" by author Dave Rendle. His poem is dedicated to Heather Heyer. A young woman was killed on August 12, 2017, when James Fields Jr. crashed into a group of protesters by car. who was fascinated by the Nazis and Adolf Hitler. <https://fb.watch/v/2RmWlxo50/>

International Day Against Violence Against Women #UzTebeSam

In BiH, **every second** woman has experienced **some form of gender-based violence**, and according to the latest statistics, since the beginning of the COVID-19 virus pandemic, there has been a **50% increase** in reported violence and, unfortunately, the percentage is growing day by day. These devastating data tell us that violence against women and girls is **a problem** in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Society and we believe that the whole society must react. **Institute for Youth Development KULT** is of the opinion that the prevention of violence against women and girls lies in the constant sending of support to victims of violence and their encouragement and the involvement of society in the prevention of this problem.



For many years, **every 25th of the month** we celebrate **Orange Day - the day of prevention of violence against women and girls** through various educational, creative and activist initiatives. In addition to Orange Day, the Institute is actively participating in the celebration of **16 days of activism** - a campaign aimed at stopping violence against women and girls and preventing this problem.

The 16 Days of Activism campaign begins on November 25, **International Day for the Prevention of Violence against Women**, and runs until December 10, International Human Rights Day.

On the occasion of marking the Orange Day and the beginning of 16 days of activism, **the Institute for Youth Development KULT** and **the NGO Obojena Klapa**, in cooperation with **the Richmond Park International High School**, conducted the **activity Drawing Graffiti STOP VIOLENCE**, during which **Benjamin Čengić** from the NGO Obojena Klapa drew with the help of students and a sketch by **Faris Šehić**, the winner of the Sketch battle STOP VIOLENCE activity.

Through these two activities, we tried to involve as many people as possible in the prevention of violence and draw attention to the importance of action in the field of violence prevention.

On this occasion, we are announcing the start of the campaign I'm with you! whose goal is to send a message of support and encouragement to women and girls victims of violence and to involve the wider

community in the prevention of this problem. A significant number of successful people from BiH supported the campaign and clearly told the victims - I am with you!

We invite everyone interested to post a photo on their Instagram and / or Facebook profiles with the caption I'm with you! and thus join the campaign using the hashtag #UzTebeSam.

Is it time for young people in politics in Bosnia and Herzegovina?

Very often we could hear it being said in public that it is necessary to give young people a chance in politics in Bosnia and Herzegovina. That chance was mostly at the level of satisfying the form or it was not there at all. The just-concluded local elections (not counting Mostar) have yielded results, which happens when you really give young people a real chance: When they are list holders or candidates for (city) mayor.

The absolute record holder in the number of votes in this election is the young Draško Stanivuković, the new mayor of Banja Luka, who, according to still unofficial data, won 51,620 votes. This makes him the person who received the largest number of individual votes in BiH; True, it is the city with the largest number of registered voters in Bosnia and Herzegovina, but it still does not diminish the success of the young person in these elections.

On the other hand, young Kenan Uzunovic, a fairly new name on the political scene in Bosnia and Herzegovina and Drask's peer, won 6,867 votes for the Zenica City Council. 94.37% of polling stations were processed, and the number of his votes could exceed 7,000 after the official results of the local elections.



Kenan is 27 years old and currently holds the record for the number of votes for municipal / city councils in the Federation of BiH. In addition to the two of them who surpassed their much older and more experienced colleagues in terms of votes, the results of young people from Visoko Belmin Zukan and Tarik Halilović should also be pointed out. within their lists. Their colleague, the candidate for the Municipal Council of Vitez, Ekrem Sarajlić, was also the holder of the list and won the mandate as the candidate with by far the largest number of votes on his list. What these three future councilors have in common is that they attended the UMiDp Training for Youth Political Leaders, organized by the KULT Institute for Youth Development. The training program is intended for young politicians aged 18 to 30, who come from different political parties and different local communities. Through 15 days of training, young politicians acquire knowledge and skills that help them to improve their actions in politics, especially in the field of youth rights. During the training, they have the opportunity to learn

theoretically and practically and build a political image that is different, more innovative and more acceptable to peers.

These results prove that young people are ready to be actively involved in politics and that they can achieve significant results when they get the right opportunity, but also that it is necessary to work on educating young women and men politicians. These elections proved that #mozeidrugacije and that young people can and will be the bearers of political and social change in Bosnia and Herzegovina. The institute will continue to analyze the election results and check how many young people will be in the council benches, including young people who have successfully completed the UMiDp training.

UMiD: XI module “Communications and Public Relations” completed

Communications and public relations is the topic of the UMiD training module - Learn, think, act! for the sixteenth generation.

UMiD training lasts one year, and the participants of the training, youth leaders, during its duration actively participate in the implementation of civic initiatives in their local communities.

UMiD has been conducted for **15 years**, and training for the 16th generation is underway. So far, **more than 300 young people** from all parts of Bosnia and Herzegovina have gone through this training.



The module was held at the **SPAJALICA Educational and Leisure Center for Youth** in Ilidža, **from November 12 to 14, 2020**.

The trainer of this module was **Aldin Alić**, Head of the Public Relations Department at the Institute for Youth Development KULT. Together with the coach, the young people talked about **media literacy, business communications, public speaking**, and they had the opportunity to apply what they had learned.

On the first day of the training, at 6.00 pm, an online debate of young candidates for the Municipal Council of Ilidža was organized.

On the second day of the training, the participants had the opportunity to give statements for the **portal Fokus.ba**, which was an opportunity for them to immediately apply what they learned and **improve their public appearance**.
