ORC/HCA ACTIVITIES IN MARCH



Training in Konjic

In the period from March 3 to 5, as part of the strategic priority aimed at building dynamic, inclusive and resilient communities, "Training for facilitating workshops and conducting educational training" was held in Konjic.

The training was attended by 23 young leaders from the communities where the Bosnia and Herzegovina Resilience Initiative (BHRI) project is implemented, and among them, on behalf of the Youth Resource Center Tuzla, were **Ammar Grabić**, **Suzana Dušanić** and **Minela Dohranović**.



Ambassador Sattler on the importance of activism and protection of human rights

After Zenica and Sarajevo, Ambassador Johann Sattler, Head of the Delegation of the European Union and EU Special Representative in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Johanna Strömquist, Ambassador of Sweden to Bosnia and Herzegovina, visited the University of Tuzla and discussed with students of the Faculty of Law the importance of activism and the protection of human rights.



The panel discussion was organized as part of a new EU project in Bosnia and Herzegovina intended for students of public universities, called Generation Change. The conversation with the students was joined by **Almasa Bečić**, the President of the Revolt Youth Movement from Tuzla and **Mirela Biković**, activist of the Youth Resource Center Tuzla. The event ended with an invitation to students to network and apply for the next phase of the #GenChange project, and get the opportunity to be part of the winning team that will visit Brussels this summer.



Anti-corruption academy within the YouTHink project

As part of the YouTHink project, the Anti-Corruption Academy was held in Sarajevo on March 20, with the aim of strengthening the rule of law in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Transparency International's research showed that Bosnia and Herzegovina has the worst situation when it comes to corruption.



The Academy gathered over 200 young people live and online from more than 35 cities in Bosnia and Herzegovina. **Mirela Biković** from the Tuzla Youth Resource Center was the mentor of the participants, and our **Suzana Dušanić** was one of the participants of the academy.



Night of quizzes in Western Herzegovina

As part of the CATNet project, we organized a night of quizzes in Western Herzegovina. The quizzes were held on March 26 and 27 in **Čitluk** and **Čapljina**. We held a general knowledge quiz that was full of excitement, laughter and incredible answers! Our players competed for valuable prizes and it was really exciting until the very end.

The aim of the visit was the exchange of experiences, working meetings with representatives of the government and the civil sector, and discussions about post-war recovery and reconstruction, where we exchanged experiences with representatives of the local government and civil society in Tuzla.

Training - Youth Information Mediator (JIMMY)



From March 28 to 30, a JIMMY training course was held in Banja Luka, which is aimed at youth workers who, in the context of their daily work, partially, but not exclusively, provide information to young people. The course is designed to develop new skills in the field of youth information and counseling for youth workers or other professionals working with young people. The training is held within the framework of the project's partner project **YinfoPioneers – Pioneering information services for young people in the Western Balkans**. Partners in this project from Bosnia and Herzegovina are **Youth Resource Center**

Tuzla and CEREBRA Banja Luka.

The goals of this training were: to promote informing young people in other sectors of youth work; develop a partnership between youth workers and youth information centers; provide a tool for youth workers to provide basic information about young people; improve the quality and availability of information to young people; improve information services for young people through feedback received from working with young people, a participant in the training in front of the Youth Resource Center was our **Suzana Dušanić**.

Annual Assembly of ALF BiH

On March 3 and 4, the Annual - Electoral Assembly of ALF BiH was held in Tuzla. During the Assembly, which was attended by 20 participants from 16 members of the ALF BiH network, the members were informed about the activities of the network and the international ALF in the past period, as well as the activities of the network coordinators. The Assembly unanimously voted for all five candidates for members of the ALF BiH Board of Directors.



The network coordinator also informed the Assembly about the reconfirmation/confirmation of membership. Organizations that have not confirmed their continued membership in the network are: **UG for promotion of Roma education "Otaharin" Bijeljina, PRONI - Center for Youth Development Brčko, Association Uzor Busovača, UG Center for Lifelong Learning (SCU) Nova Bila - Travnik and Prof.Dr. Emel Topcu – Dean of the International University of Sarajevo.**



After the assembly, the constituent meeting of the Management Board of ALF BiH was held. At the meeting, the President of the Board of Directors - Ivan Sajević and Vice President - Novica Bogdanović were elected. In addition to the election part, the Supervisory Board also discussed the calendar of activities of the network for this year.

The Board of Directors made a decision that members who did not confirm their membership in the network will be removed from membership in ALF BiH, with the provision that, sometime in the future, if they request membership in ALF BiH, it will be possible for them to do so.

On the second day of the meeting, the participants in groups worked practically on the work strategy of ALF BiH for this year, and on the strategy of improving the communications of network members.

As part of this, the launch of a fb group for ALF BiH members, the launch of a website, and the collection of information from members (identity cards) were considered so that the Network would have data on what it has at its disposal.

Meeting of the Board of Directors of ALF BiH Banja Luka, March 26, 2023

In accordance with the decisions of the constituent meeting of the Board of Directors in Tuzla, the second regular meeting of the Board of Directors of ALF BiH was held in Banja Luka. The meeting was held as part of the "Keza Fest" theater festival, organized by DIS Theater Banja Luka, with the support of the City Administration of Banja Luka, and the Euro-Mediterranean Foundation "ALF" - Bosnian network.

Some of the conclusions of the meeting were: Work on amendments and additions to the Agreement on the cooperation of ALF BiH members; continuation of visits to members of ALF BiH by members of the Board of Directors and strengthening of promotion of ALF BiH towards other organizations and the public; invitation to ALF BiH members to participate in this year's Book Fair in Sarajevo (from April 12 to 17) with promotional materials, publications and others; joint application for this year's Freedom Festival...



After the meeting of the Board of Directors, we held a meeting with organizations from Banja Luka: City Youth Council of Banja Luka, "Guardians of the Smile" Banja Luka, and "White Angel" Banja Luka, to which the network coordinator, Miralem Tursinović, and members of the Board of Directors of ALF BiH presented the work, structure and activities of ALF BiH, and invited them and explained how they can, if they wish, join the network.



Screening of the film "Returning to Višegrad"

In the "Kaleidoskop" Hall, Tuzla, on March 28, we organized the screening of the documentary film: "Returning to Višegrad". The film was directed by: Julie Biro and Antoine Jaccoud. The film tells about the post-war meeting of a generation, which at the beginning of the war was in the 4th grade of elementary school, and due to the hardships of the war, moved around the region. The film was shown with the support of the Embassy of Switzerland in BiH and with the support of the Tuzla Youth Theater.

Daily workshops



The youth organization Svitac continued with its daily interactive and online activities. Younger participants did age-appropriate creative and educational activities with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they talked about rain, wind, clouds, rainbows, trees, spring and weather. The participants enjoyed drawing and making clouds and rainbows, small turtles and robots from different materials and were happy to take them home. They continued with the alphabet and learned to write the letters E, F, G, H, I, J. They did

warm-up exercises and yoga for the children, and every Thursday they danced and practiced listening to stories. Some of the stories they read this month are: The Ugly Duckling, Little Red Riding Hood, Edge and Mary, Pinocchio and Cinderella. The goal of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.



Ages 13+ took part in discussions/workshops on: the British education system, social justice, mine awareness and how to be more socially aware online. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, where they can express their opinion.

At the English and German workshops, they learned modal verbs (know, have to, want), repeated vocabulary from the past months and verbs in the present tense, wrote dictations, read and translated short texts and phrases, worked on practicing everyday communication and grammar, learned new vocabulary, and worked on interesting presentations and projects.

Zero Discrimination Day

Youth organization Svitac marked the Day of Zero Discrimination with a discussion with 16+ participants. Zero Discrimination Day is celebrated on March 1st every year and aims to combat structural and cultural prejudices and promote equality and justice in societies around the world. It also highlights how people can become informed and promote inclusion, compassion, peace and, above all, movement for change. Our goal was to provide participants with a tool for critical thinking about the world around them. For our first activity, we looked at how role models presented in the media can influence our own prejudices and opinions. Then for our second activity we focused on gender discrimination and unconscious bias; we talked about what unconscious bias is using examples from everyday life. The participants were very engaged in the conversation, and during the workshop they also had the opportunity to try traditional English cakes brought by one of our international volunteers from Great Britain. The workshop was held in the premises of the Youth Center of Brčko District.

International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination

The International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination is marked on the international calendar on March 21. Youth organization Svitac held two workshops with students on this topic in the gymnasium. Marlen and Lotte, the international volunteers who led the workshops, encouraged the students to share their views on the topics: the problem of racism in the constitution of Bosnia and Herzegovina, racism at borders and migration in Europe, local problems with racism and personal experiences of discrimination. Participants openly discussed and touched on discrimination and poor treatment of various migrants at European borders, as well as personal experiences.

The workshop started with a game called "one step forward", all the students stood in a line, each student got a role, they were asked questions and if the answer was "yes" they had to take a step forward. As they answered questions and took steps, the gap between the different roles grew wider. After this game, students were invited to analyze the results and discuss why some people experience more racism and others less. Marlen and Lotte also discussed the definition of racism, and then the students watched a video about racism in our everyday lives. At the end, the students worked in groups and presented their

own views on this issue and talked about the existence of racism in their city and about their own experiences.



International Day of Happiness



Youth organization Svitac celebrated the International Day of Happiness with a group of young people! At the beginning of the workshop, the participants created a poster on the question: What do we need to be happy? They filled the poster with many words such as family, friends, freedom, peace, good food, music, free time, tolerance, nature, coffee, education and knowledge, hope and many more. Then Maika, one of the international volunteers, introduced Bhutan, a kingdom in South Asia whose political state principle is happiness. They thought about the question: What would our land of happiness

look like? The participants also created a poster for it. They drew the shape of the island and thought about the most important rules in this country: freedom of choice, freedom of speech, freedom of gender, freedom of religion and equality. They would live in a democracy with free education and free health care. They would have public transportation. The most important values would be respect and tolerance. At first, they thought it would be easy to design such a "perfect" state. But then they saw that it was not that simple. How far can individual freedom go? Is it okay to say racist or homophobic things? How can we ensure wealth equality? How can we protect nature and at the same time ensure that everyone has enough food? All the questions that are very trending...

And how would we measure happiness in our country? Can happiness even be measured? The UN tries to do this every year. Creates an annual ranking of happiness. We discussed the factors the UN uses to determine its ranking. Do they really determine human happiness? The last question they discussed was: Should all states have happiness as the primary goal of their policies? Most participants said yes. But what is happiness and who defines it?

The workshop was held in the premises of the Youth Center Brčko District.

The continuation of all activities of the Svitac Youth Organization is planned for April.

The dialogue between young people and diplomatic representatives of the Netherlands, Switzerland, Belgium, Germany and Spain exceeded all expectations

A Dialogue of young people and diplomatic representatives of the Netherlands, Belgium, Switzerland, Germany and Spain was held in Livno. The dialogue was attended by young people from Livno and surrounding towns such as Bugojno, Glamoč and Tomislavgrad, who are members of non-governmental organizations, activists, volunteers, students and entrepreneurs.



The young people had the opportunity to talk with the ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in BiH Jan Waltmans, the ambassador of the Swiss Confederation in BiH Daniel Hunn, the head of the Diplomatic Office of the Kingdom of Belgium in BiH Benjamin Sturtewagen, the ambassador of the Federal Republic of Germany in BiH Thomas Fitschen and the ambassador of the Kingdom of Spain in BiH María Teresa Lizaranza Perinate.

During the Dialogue, young people pointed out the needs and problems they face in this part of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the topics that were particularly discussed were corruption and its impact on social, political and economic life, perspectives for young people with an emphasis on employment, self-employment and support for entrepreneurship, and youth activism and their involvement in decision-making processes in the local communities they come from. Young people expressed satisfaction for the opportunity to talk with diplomatic representatives and point out needs and problems, as well as ideas and solutions that would improve their position. Diplomatic representatives emphasized the importance of continuous dialogue with young people in an effort to contribute to the improvement of the status of young people in the activities they carry out in Bosnia and Herzegovina. The messages and attitudes of young people will be useful to them when talking with representatives of BiH authorities to whom they are trying to point out the necessity of creating adequate policies that will advance and improve the quality of life of young people.

The Institute for Youth Development KULT supported the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Bosnia and Herzegovina in organizing this event, which continues the successful cooperation with embassies, believing that events like this can result in better opportunities for young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina.



With the play *Ti, Ja i Štela* and a panel discussion, young people resisted corruption in society

The Institute for Youth Development KULT, through the project Say NO to Corruption in Sarajevo Canton, points to the problem of corruption in our society. Creative young people decided, in a slightly different way, to resist corruption, and with the presence of many young people interested in this topic, the event "Corruption - the longest play in the history of Bosnia and Herzegovina" was held. The event consisted of two parts: the performance "Ti, Ja i Štela" and the panel discussion "Ti i Ja protiv Štele".



The performance "Ti, Ja i Štela" is part of the anti-corruption project of the Association "Dignitet" from Mostar, and an author's work whose text and direction is signed by Ivo Čarapina, and which was phenomenally performed by a young cast. Symbolically, this play showed in a satirical way how to solve the problem of unemployment in a corrupt society.

The panel discussion "Ti i Ja protiv Štele" aimed to encourage young people to proactively engage in the fight against corruption through conversation, exchange of opinions and information, and this is only possible if we speak out bravely, and if the state and institutions provide us with the necessary support and protection. Along with the author of the play, Ivo Čarapina, the panelists included actress Jasna Diklić, and Sarina Bakić, a professor at the Faculty of Political Sciences in Sarajevo.

The young people did not hide their enthusiasm for the show and the panel discussion, so besides having a good time, they actively participated by asking questions, and they continued their socializing with a quiz about corruption.

Since September 2021, the Institute has been actively working on the implementation of the "Say No to Corruption!" initiative, in cooperation with the Office for Combating Corruption and Quality Management of Sarajevo Canton.

The initiative is implemented with the support of the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands.



Joint forces for better education of young people in Sarajevo Canton

The Institute for Youth Development KULT has been advocating for a better position of young people since its establishment until today, and the quality of education is one of the priorities that the Institute advocates in all policies towards young people, for which it especially advocates and participates in its creation.

Precisely because of the fact that the Institute's research, as well as other research, show that young people are not satisfied with the education system in BiH, the Institute held consultative meetings and signed a Memorandum of Cooperation with the Public Institution Institute for the Development of Pre-University Education of the Sarajevo Canton, whose mission is to create and build the future Sarajevo Canton through general, social and economic progress, with better and better education of the generations to come. The Institute for the Development of Pre-University Education of Sarajevo Canton is an advisory, educational and coordinating body that initiates and directs growth and development of the educational system in Sarajevo Canton.

Quality cooperation of all actors of the educational process, their motivation, dedicated and responsible work, continuous learning and professional development of all involved are the foundation for the development of pedagogical and scientific standards for quality education. Ultimately, this means better education and the progress of the entire Bosnian-Herzegovinian society.



The Memorandum of Cooperation allows the Institute for Youth Development KULT and the Institute for Pre-University Education to jointly support the development of young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina through training and activities for young people, as well as the joint creation of new programs and initiatives for teaching and professional staff in high schools in the Sarajevo Canton.

In practice, the Institute for Youth Development KULT plans to offer training to teaching and professional staff of secondary schools, more training in the field of service and experiential learning in teaching, and to increase cooperation between schools and local youth organizations.

- Assistance to Citizens in the Fight Against Corruption (CCI)

The goal of the ACFC project is to increase the participation of citizens in the fight against corruption. All project activities are designed and designed in such a way as to encourage strong and sustainable anti-corruption activism throughout the country, and at all levels. Among other things, the project through the program of small grants will support informal groups of citizens and civil society organizations to work on solving specific anti-corruption initiatives in the field of fighting corruption at the local level, and launch campaigns aimed at higher levels of government.

- up to USD 50,000.00 is the possible value of the project intended for implementation advocacy activities and initiatives aimed at higher levels of government, lasting up to 12 months

Support program for the protection of human rights (USAID/INSPIRE)
