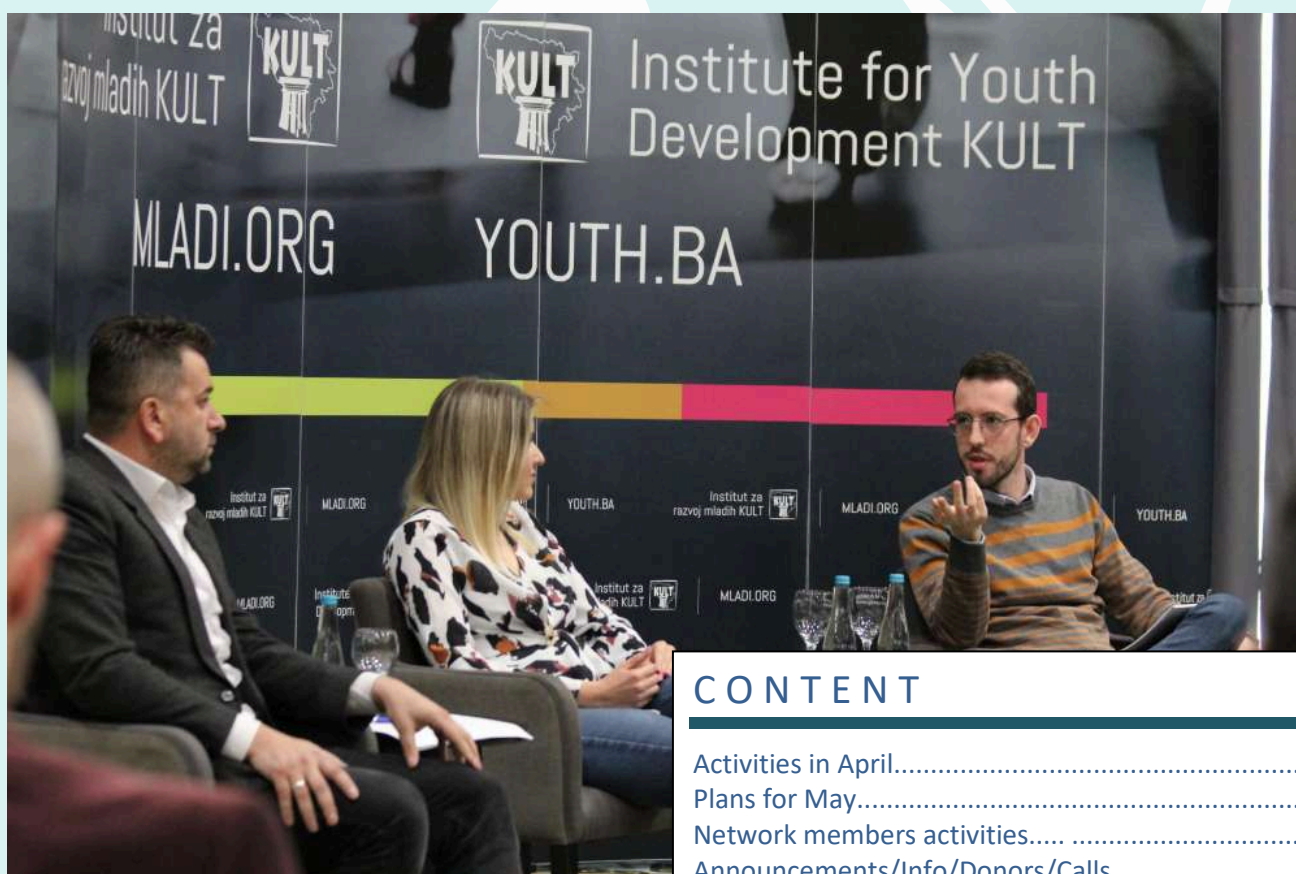

„Our community – our responsibility“



The Tuzla Community Foundation has signed contracts on the support of 23 civic initiatives, for which they allocated more than 72,000 KM, which will be implemented by citizens' associations and youth associations in 2023. Among the approved projects is the project of the Youth Resource Center Tuzla called "My Green Footprint". This time, FTZ supported, among other things, inter-entity projects in

Teoćak, an education project on the basics of sign writing for police officers and health workers in Banovići, a project to introduce chess to schools in Gradačac, the inclusion of people with disabilities in Čelić, and numerous others.

The support is implemented through the project "Our community is our responsibility", which we implement with the support of USAID BiH, within the #SnagaLokalnog program.

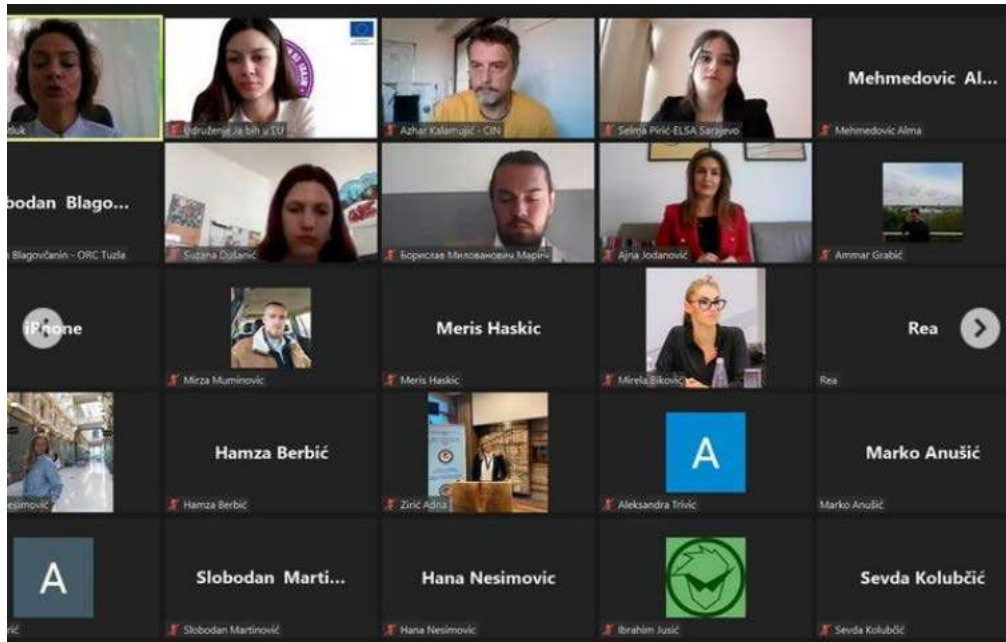


Panel discussion – The Role of the Media and non-governmental Organizations in strenghtening the Judicial system

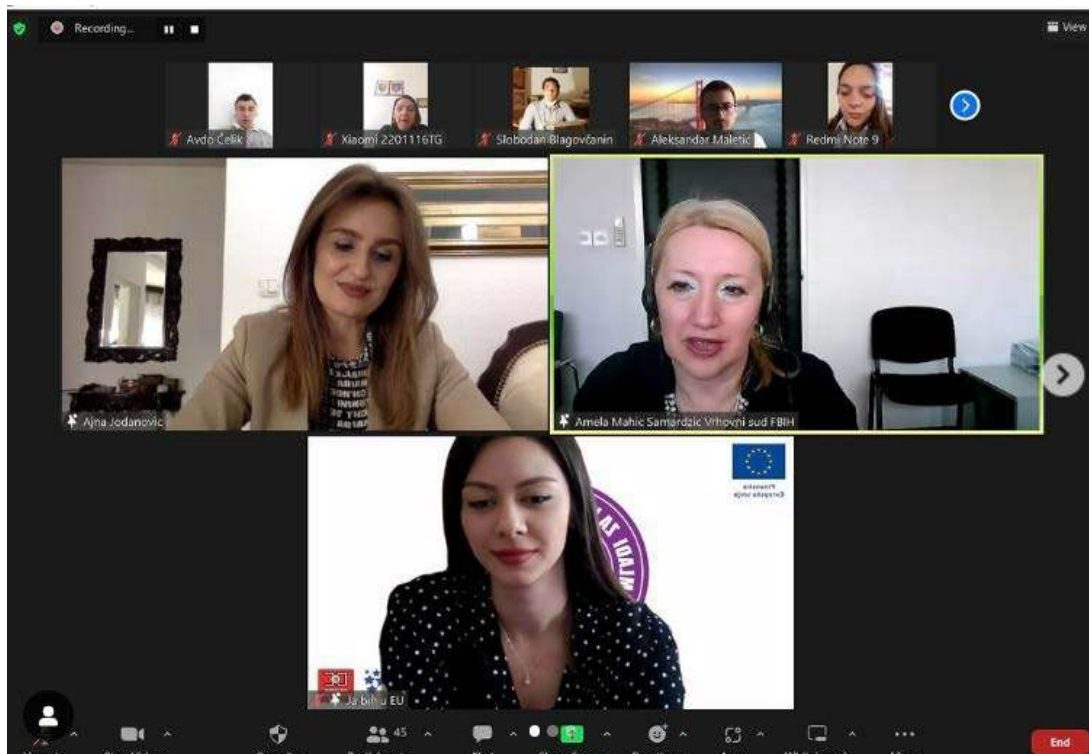
Panel discussion - The role of media and non-governmental organizations in strengthening the judicial system organized by **JaBiHEU** together with **ORC Tuzla** as part of the project **Youth for the Rule of Law.**

"It is surprising that young people, participants of the panel, despite the depressing circumstances in the country, show an interest in judicial processes, that they recognize the weaknesses of the judiciary and that they are motivated to contribute to its improvement. I am especially glad that they understand

the danger of spreading inaccurate and unreliable ", said Azhar Kalamujić, From the Center for Investigative Journalism. The project is financed by the **European Union**.



Panel – „Youth and the judiciary“



Youth and the judiciary - restoring the trust of young people in the judicial institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina was the topic of the panel held as part of the Youth for the Rule of Law project. Panelists of the **Association of Women Judges of BiH**, **Amela Mahić Samardžić** and **Ajla Papović Mujan**, talked with young people about their view of the rule of law and the attitude of young people towards judicial institutions.

“The participants got an excellent opportunity to talk directly with the judges. In addition, the Rule of Law manual is the crown and the pinnacle of the work on this project, it is the ideal publication from which we can learn everything about basic human rights and law. It is done in a very accessible language that everyone can understand.”, said Borislav Marić, one of the panel participants.

The cooperation between young people and judicial institutions is of great importance, which is precisely what the project #mladizavladavinuprava is witnessing which is realized by JaBiHEU i ORC Tuzla. The project is financed by the European Union.



YinfoPioneers – Pioneering information services for young people in the Western Balkans



In Barcelona, in the period from April 20 to 21, a meeting of the YinfoPioneers Project Consortium - Pioneering information services for young people in the Western Balkans was held.

During the two-day meeting, the previous activities within the project were discussed, but further activities were also planned:

- Holding a "Dialogue Day" where the results of the focus groups held in the previous period will be presented to youth workers and political entities, as well as the media;
- Preparation of ALTYO training, which will be held in Struga (Northern Macedonia) from June 19 to 23. Five selected young people from all partner organizations in the project will participate in this training, and the invitation to participate will be announced during May;
- Development of strategies for the development and coordination of Youth Info Centers in the countries of the Western Balkans



On the second day of the meeting, the partners had the opportunity to visit organizations in Barcelona that deal with youth information issues:

Espai Jove Cerdanyola – youth center, **PIJ La Fletxa - Premià de Dalt** (youth information point), Youth office and counseling center (**CIAJ**), i **Catalan Youth Agency Barcelona**. During the study visit, we learned about the work and activities of these organizations, and the services they provide to young people.

ORC & HCA TUZLA REGULAR ACTIVITIES

During April, we worked on maintaining and developing communications and coordination within the Youth Network of Bosnia and Herzegovina (www.orctuzla.ba). As part of this, we distributed information of interest to young people and youth activism in BiH every day on the network's mailing list (omladina@orctuzla.ba), but also to other addresses in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the region. We corresponded with organizations and individuals interested in the work of the network, responded to inquiries related to certain activities, education and other information related to youth activism in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Likewise, our project team continued with applications for projects.

Over 120 young people showed interest in the activities of the Institute for Youth Development KULT



STARfest, the first festival for career development, offered an excellent program for young people, over 50 exhibitors, 30 inspiring speakers, a large number of educational workshops, and numerous useful information when it comes to the labor market and concrete offers for young people (opportunities, jobs, scholarships, education etc.). The Institute for Youth Development KULT was part of this story, and the employees of the Institute enjoyed spending two days socializing with young people, getting to know them better about the Institute's programs and the opportunities that are available to all interested young people. The exchange of information, opinions and interests will be especially useful in creating some new opportunities for young people. The

questions were very diverse, in accordance with the interests of the young people, and what they were particularly interested in was what kind of training program is conducted by the Institute and what kind of knowledge they can acquire there, how they can become participants of the Institute's trainings, and how they can get more detailed information about of the future about the work of the Institute and the opportunities it offers to young people. During these two days, over 120 young people showed interest in the programs of the Institute for Youth Development KULT and expressed their desire to be part of the activities that the Institute will organize for young people in the future.

A certain number of young people who have already attended events organized by the Institute said that they want to be a part of future activities. Participation in STARfest was an excellent opportunity for the Institute to connect and get to know many young people, with new potential partners and collaborators, all with the aim of creating a better future for young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina.



Sarajevo continues to prepare for the application for the European Youth Capital 2026!

Mayor Benjamina Karić met with representatives of youth associations and youth councils that support the City for the Sarajevo - European Youth Capital 2026 application.

The development of quality and sustainable policies towards young people, and opportunities that truly change the lives of young people in Sarajevo and Bosnia and Herzegovina is the direction that Sarajevo is following, and which will be intensified in the coming period. On this occasion, the Mayor hosted representatives of the Institute for Youth Development KULT, representatives of the Association for Social, Cultural and Creative Development ZORA, the



FBiH Youth Council and the Youth Council of the Municipality of Novo Sarajevo, in order to discuss the continuation of cooperation and work on the initiative Sarajevo - European Youth Capital 2026.

Sarajevo was shortlisted for the prestigious title of European Youth Capital 2026, and this success is, among other things, the result of the excellent cooperation of the City of Sarajevo with associations that supported this process and invested their resources in order to ensure that Sarajevo is also on the list of the most successful cities in Europe. At the meeting, policies towards young people and their importance were presented, as well as the importance of involving young people in processes such as the application for the European Youth Capital. The concept of co-management and the importance of young people in the application and implementation processes were considered.

In the coming period, Mayor Karić will play a key role in the promotion of Sarajevo as the capital of young people in Europe, and joint events will be organized and messages sent to the general public. The title itself for Sarajevo would mean more investment in youth programs that will improve the position of young people.

Sarajevo continues to prepare for the application for the European Youth Capital 2026, and young people will play a key role in the application process and the implementation of the title. The most important thing that this title brings is sustainability, concrete work and investment in young people, and the inclusion of young people in decision-making, because young people have knowledge, ideas and proposals for a better Bosnian society.



With the conference “Together for good and sustainable policies towards young people” to new opportunities and ideas

The conference Together for good and sustainable policies towards young people was held on April 25, 2023. and the focus of the conference was on the participation and involvement of young people in the work of youth commissions at all levels (municipal, city, cantonal and entity), and on the creation of a budget for young people.

The guests of the panel were politicians from all levels of government. The topic of the first panel was Participation of young people in decision-making: opportunities and positive practice, and the panel discussed with Nedim Alibegović, who held the position of secretary general of the FBiH Youth Council, the president of the commission for youth issues of the Parliament of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Eldar Čomora, and the president of the Board of Directors of the Youth Council of the Republic of Srpska , Dijano Gašić.

The President of the Commission for Youth Affairs of the Parliament of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Eldar Čomora, conveyed positive experiences from the thematic session, which can serve as an example of youth participation in decision-making processes, and emphasized the commission's efforts to cooperate with the umbrella body for youth in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina in the future, with the aim of improving the position of young people and the importance of including young people in commissions.



On the second panel, a representative of the Department for Education, Culture and Sports from the Municipality of Novo Sarajevo was interviewed

by Merima Serdarević on the budget for youth, and after that the attendees were given the task in groups to identify challenges in creating a budget for youth and find the best solutions to overcome those challenges. The participants agreed that this conference was very useful for all of them, and that the exchange of knowledge and experiences is always a step forward towards better opportunities for young people in the community.

With this conference, the Institute continues to develop and advocate legal and other strategic solutions, as well as to build and strengthen the capacities of associations and authorities in BiH and the region, for successful and sustainable policies towards young people, which can only be achieved through the joint engagement of representatives of government institutions, i.e. politicians who act on different levels of government in Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as representatives of non-governmental organizations that work with young people.

Daily workshops

The youth organization Svitac continued with its daily interactive and online activities. Younger participants did age-appropriate creative and educational activities with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they talked about spring, insects, flowers, parrots, mermaids and the sun. The participants enjoyed making butterflies, caterpillars, jellyfish, frogs, rabbits and hanging ornaments, which they used to decorate the walls of the workshop. They also continued with music workshops, rehearsing rhythms and a song about a fox and a visibaba. They continued with the alphabet and learned to write the letters K, L, M, Lj, N, O. They did warm-up exercises and yoga for the children, and every Thursday they danced and practiced listening to stories. Some of the stories they read this month are: Beauty and the Beast, Snow White, Cinderella, The Little Mermaid and Thumbelina. The goal of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.



Age 13+ participated in discussions/workshops on the topics: racism, discrimination, happiness, climate and environmental protection, dangers of light and hard drugs, advantages and disadvantages of sharing an apartment with roommates. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, where they can express their opinion.

At the English and German workshops, they learned modal verbs (to be able, have to and want), the basics of declension of adjectives, repeated vocabulary from the past months and verbs in the present tense,

wrote dictations, read and translated short texts and phrases, worked on practicing everyday communication and grammar, learned new vocabulary, and worked on interesting presentations and projects.



Guitar workshops

The participants continued to work on more demanding guitar compositions such as "Capriccio no. 23 and 24" (L. Legnani), "Travels" (Pat Metheny), but also on less demanding exercises by J. Sagreras.



Samba workshops

The participants rehearsed eleven compositions that were worked on in recent months and started working on three new compositions: "Little being", "Harvest time" and "Plough".



International Zero Waste Day

For the International Day of Zero Waste, we used the opportunity to hold a discussion workshop with young people, where they talked about protecting the climate and the environment. Lenja, the coordinator of the workshop, spoke about two topics in the introduction: what is the principle of zero waste and what is 'Earth Overshoot Day'. After the introduction, the group was divided into two teams to play an environmental quiz about pollution and resource consumption. After the final quiz question, participants discussed plastic in the oceans. After that, they had the so-called silent discussion. They were given four questions, written on a poster: Is climate change and environmental protection a problem in Bosnia and Herzegovina/Germany?, Is climate and environmental protection an important issue?, What can we do to protect the climate and environment?, What should the state do to protect the climate and the environment? Participants had time to write their opinion on the questions on the posters and read what others had written. These thoughts were shared in the group and the participants had a lively discussion on the topic of ecology, which was also the goal of this workshop. This was also interesting because the group consisted of young people from BiH and Germany, and they could exchange experiences from their countries. The second goal of this workshop was, of course, to draw attention to the problem of pollution and waste generation and to initiate environmental initiatives.



International Day of Street Children

Every year, on April 12, the International Day of Street Children gives a voice to the children who live on the streets, and reminds that their rights cannot be ignored. Youth organization Svitac celebrated this day with the youngest participants! The workshop was very creative and fun - they made a "Happy House" for every child who has nowhere to live, and the participants also discussed the importance of a safe home and family. In addition, our youngest drew their own house and built skyscrapers with Lego blocks.



Earth Day

Earth Day is an annual event celebrated on April 22, which demonstrates support for environmental protection. It is also our only home and it needs our help to maintain itself! We should all take part in activities like protecting nature, taking care of rivers and seas, picking up litter and planting trees! Youth organization Svitac celebrated Earth Day with the youngest participants! We watched two videos about our planet Earth and learned how to preserve and protect it. Our youngest also colored worksheets and made a wonderful poster of the planet with flowers and leaves as decoration. The workshop was held in the premises of the Youth Center Brčko District BiH.

The continuation of all activities of the Svitac Youth Organization is planned for May.

In front of you is the application form for participation in the "Living Library" project organized by Naida Hajro and Merjem Mašić in support of non-governmental organizations Social and Cultural Center Sarajevo, Sarajevo Open Center, CURE Foundation, Wings of Hope Foundation and the Helsinki Citizens' Parliament of Banja Luka.

The Living Library is an interactive concept that encourages dialogue and understanding between different groups of people in order to break existing stereotypes and prejudices against minority communities. It is based on the idea where participants have the opportunity to "borrow books" with which they can meet and talk. Each "book" in the living library represents a person who has a specific experience or perspective on a topic, such as e.g. nationality, religion, migration, mental or physical health, gender identity, sexuality or unconventional lifestyle.

The German Konrad Adenauer Foundation invites all interested parties to apply for scholarships for the academic year 2023/2024. intended for socially and politically engaged and gifted students in their final years of the faculty, as well as postgraduates and doctoral students studying in Montenegro.

DESCRIPTION

The Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung is a political foundation active throughout Germany and abroad. Their headquarters are in Berlin, where in 1998 they opened a new event location, the Academy, and in 2005 an office, which was expanded once again until 2019. The Konrad-Adenauer Foundation developed from the Society for Christian Democratic Education, which was founded way back in 1955. . years. Since 1964, it has been named after the first federal chancellor, Konrad Adenauer.

They create scientific foundations and the latest analyzes that provide predictions for political action. One of their key competencies is imparting political education to the general public. Furthermore, the Konrad-

Adenauer Foundation supports talented young people and advocates for literature, art and culture.

CONDITIONS

To apply for this scholarship you need to:

- Students from the 3rd year of study (from September 2023), as well as postgraduates and doctoral students, can get the scholarship opportunity.
- The minimum average for studies is 8.5
- Good knowledge of English or German
- The age limit of the candidate is 30 years
- The candidate must not be employed
- The application deadline is June 9, 2023.
- Students who are selected to the shortlist will be invited to an interview (in Montenegrin and English) with members of the scholarship awarding committee.
- Financial support is paid to selected students in the amount of 150 euros per month for 10 months
- The selected scholarship holders are obliged to provide KAS with proof of the course of their studies, and if the scholarship holder discontinues his studies, he is obliged to return the money to KAS
- In addition to financial support, scholarship holders are also allowed to attend seminars and other activities organized by KAS

HOW TO APPLY

In order to apply, you need to submit the following documents:

1. completed application form (you can download it from the website of your faculty or UCG)
2. CV in English
3. motivational letter in English
4. certificate of passed exams

*** for POSTGRADUATE / DOCTORAL STUDIES**

a photocopy of the diploma from undergraduate studies and a certificate of enrollment must be submitted

postgraduate / doctoral studies

7. two academic recommendations
8. one recommendation related to political or social engagement (recommendation from a party, NGO or student organization - depending on the type of engagement)
9. recent photo (L.C. or passport format)
10. other diplomas, certificates, copies

Additional information when applying:

1. Electronic delivery of documentation is not possible
2. Incomplete candidate documentation will not be considered
3. After the election of new scholarship holders, the candidate's documentation is kept at the Foundation for a maximum of 3 months after the election, the candidate can pick it up in person or, upon request, it can be returned to him by mail
4. Recommendations must be on the faculty's letterhead and signed by the professor
5. The Konrad Adenauer Foundation in Montenegro awards a total of 9 scholarships per year
6. All candidates who applied for the scholarship will be informed about the official results of the competition no later than 20 days after the election
7. Candidates are informed about the results of the competition via email, and individual explanations are not provided as to why the candidate was not accepted into the program.

On the occasion of the anniversary of the birth of the Bosnian writer Sukrija Pandža, the School Legium is announcing the seventh competition for an essay on the topic Where are the parents at school today?

We expect authors to answer questions such as:

Do parents help the school or pay back? When (if) is their contribution to upbringing and education constructive, and when (if) is it destructive? Are they asking too little or too much? Is their role overrated or underrated? Does the law adequately recognize parental rights? How do parental and

teacher competencies collide or overlap? Does the school reform also apply to parents? (Continue the series...)

School practice is rich, varied and depends on numerous specific circumstances. One of the key factors in her progress is the participation of her parents. What it is, what it could be, what it shouldn't be... What do you have to say about it as a parent, what as an educator, what as a citizen whose voice defines educational policy and, depending on it, the results of education.

We invite you to present your answers to some of the posed or similar questions in the form of an essay of up to 10,000 characters, referring to specific examples from personal experience or to research, studies and articles dedicated to this topic, and in this way contribute to the necessary and high-quality discussion about unused resources in raising and educating those on whom the world rests.

The best three works will be awarded with a diploma and a monetary amount:

1st prize 1.000 KM

2nd prize 600 KM

3rd prize 300 KM

You can send works until June 30, 2023 to the address konkurs@skolegijum.ba with the subject "Competition application", in one of the text documents (docx, txt, rtf...). The title of the paper must be unique and different from the title/topic of the competition.

One author can send several works.

With each work, it is necessary to provide updated contact information (name and surname, place you come from, phone number). Papers that contain elements contrary to the journalistic code will not be published. During the selection of the best, the editors can narrow down the selection and inform the readers about it.

The results will be announced at the end of August 2023.
