## ORC/HCA ACTIVITIES IN MAY



### Youth Conference "Building Peace and Security", Sarajevo, May 25-26, 2023.

The incredible conference on building peace and security organized by the Youth Resource Center Tuzla/CAT Bosnia and Herzegovina in the Parliamentary Assembly for over 50 young people from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina has ended.

The conference was held in Sarajevo, May 25-26, under the auspices of the NATO Department for Public Diplomacy, Brussels, and with the support of the BiH Parliamentary Assembly. More than 50 young people from several cities of Bosnia and Herzegovina participated in the conference.



During the two days of the conference, young people had the opportunity to hear amazing speeches, participate in interesting discussions and connect with amazing people who share the same passion for building peace. It was the right platform to exchange ideas, create new partnerships and initiate change. In addition to serious work, we also had moments to relax and have fun, and on the first day young people participated in interactive workshops where they defined the biggest current obstacles to peace and stability in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and proposed solutions - the opinion of young people so that they could be actively involved in solving certain problems.

## HUB – for digital security

After the completion of the 5 modules of the Hub Academy for Digital Security, a formal conference was held organized by the JaBiHEU Association, where one of the panelists was Mirela Biković, mentor on the mentioned project.

The Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Jan Waltmans, said that in the modern era, the media and social media generate huge amounts of information, and people who read that information are not able to distinguish what is true and what is not. According to him, it is very important that the media and journalists have the freedom to seek information, especially from the authorities, and to express different opinions and interpretations of what is important and what is not.



*It is also important that young people know how to think about what they see in the media, because certain individuals and groups use this freedom to spread false information and sow hatred and division - said Ambassador Waltmans.*

## PRESPA forum for dialogue - Panel "Road to 2030" Skopje



At the invitation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of North Macedonia, director of ORC Tuzla and national coordinator of ALF BiH, Miralem Tursinović, was in Skopje from May 7 to 9, where he participated in the panel discussion "Road to 2030".

The panel was organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of North Macedonia, as a preparatory event for the PRESPA Forum for Dialogue, which will be held in Struga on

June 15 and 16 this year. During the presentation, but also in bilateral meetings with representatives of the Ministry, non-governmental organizations from the region, and representatives of international organizations and embassies, who attended the panel, Miralem Tursinović emphasized, among other things, the importance of networking, as well as the exchange of culture and dialogue between countries in the Western Balkans.

The EU enlargement process, from the perspective of EU candidate/accession countries, marked certain steps forward. North Macedonia and Albania opened accession negotiations, while Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ukraine and Moldova received candidate status. However, despite these positive developments, there are still many obstacles on the bumpy



road to Brussels. Given these complex and unpredictable circumstances, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of North Macedonia is preparing the third edition of the Prespa Forum Dialogue 2023 (PFD2023) entitled "Extended European Family by 2030: Mission (Im)possible?" which will be held on June 15 and 16, 2023 in Struga, a picturesque town on the shores of Lake Ohrid.

Following the established tradition, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs organized, as a precursor to PFD2023, a pre-event called "Road to 2030", whose goal is to exchange analytical thoughts and ideas that would serve as a valuable contribution to the session and panel discussions on PFD2023.

During the round table, an exhibition of the conceptual solutions of all the architects who participated in the competition of the City of Sarajevo for the creation of the conceptual solution of the memorial on Kazan near Sarajevo was shown.

The youth organization Svitac continued with its daily interactive and online activities. Younger participants did age-appropriate creative and educational activities with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they talked about farm animals, mushrooms, spring, insects, butterflies and bees. Participants enjoyed making butterflies, carnival cups, little chickens and colorful mushrooms. They also continued with music workshops, rehearsing rhythms and a song about a fox and a visibaba. They continued with the alphabet and learned to write the letters P,

R, S, Š, T, U. They did warm-up exercises and yoga for children, and every Thursday they danced, played sports and practiced reading and listening to stories. The goal of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.



Ages 13+ participated in discussions/workshops on: fake news, capitalism, happiness, minimalism, consumerism, environment. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, where they can express their opinion.

In the English and German workshops, they learned to use adverbial clauses for place and time, repeated vocabulary from previous months and verbs in the present and past tense, wrote dictations, read and translated short texts and phrases, worked on practicing everyday communication and grammar, learned new vocabulary, and worked on interesting presentations and projects.



## SVITAC Guitar workshops

Among the new songs, etudes and compositions that the participants worked on are: "Capriccio no. 23, 24, 25 and 26" (L. Legnani), "Two etudes in C major" (M. Carrsasi), "Napoleon's cry" (J. Szabo) and "Yesterday" (Beatles).



## SVITAC Samba workshops

The group worked on two new compositions: Relict and Neboskop. The first one is fairly straight-forward rock in E minor, while the second one is somewhat more rhythmically complicated. It starts in 4/4 time, goes to 11/8 and ends in 12/8.



## SVITAC International Family Day

The United Nations began to focus on family-related issues in the 1980s, and since then, May 15 has been celebrated as the International Day of the Family.

In the Svitac Youth Organization, we held a workshop with children on the topic of families and the importance of having a safe place where we can always come. We used a picture frame with symbols as

a technique for drawing family members. We also created a beautiful poster with key words and symbols such as support, happiness, love, home and security. By sharing this information and discussing it together, participants shared knowledge and feelings about their families and discussed the importance of family.



## World Day of Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development

The United Nations has declared the World Day of Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development to celebrate the richness of the world's cultures and the essential role of intercultural dialogue in achieving peace and sustainable development.

Youth organization Svitac marked this day with its participants. We talked with our youngest about cultural differences in food, clothing, dance and sign language. Our volunteer from Turkey, Zeliha, showed a few words in Turkish sign language, and the participants had fun practicing them. We also talked with them about the continents, and different animals and customs. We made a banner with flags from different countries and a poster with animals.

With participants 16+, we shared food that everyone brought from home and homemade rose flower juice, which is typical for this part of the year in Bosnia and Herzegovina. This group also made a poster on the topic of culture, dialogue and diversity.

The continuation of all activities of the Svitac Youth Organization is planned for June.

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## Successful orange collaboration - photos, film and panel discussion sent a strong message to young people

The cooperation between the Institute for Youth Development KULT and the Dobrinja High School resulted in interesting activities as part of the celebration of Orange Day. For almost a decade, the Institute has been celebrating Orange Day every 25th of the month, the day of the fight against violence against women and girls, with the aim of sending messages of support to the victims and raising awareness of gender equality.



The students of Dobrinja High School, under the mentorship of Professor Aida Hasović, primarily created and shared on social networks photos dedicated to Orange Day, and thus creatively decided to draw the attention of their peers to this very widespread problem. The day after, in the premises of this school, a short video on Cyberbullying was shown, followed by the film "Voiceless", and a panel discussion was held.

One of the panelists was Zorana Tovilović from the Institute for Youth Development KULT. Zorana told the young people a little more about the importance and celebration of Orange Day at the Institute, and informed the attendees how they can get involved in the activities organized by the Institute every month.

Panel participants Munevera Hodžić - Lemeš, manager of Safe House in Sarajevo, and Jasmina Buljić, psychologist at Safe House, added that violence is not a problem of the individual but of the entire social community, and that the perpetrator is solely responsible for violence.

After the panel, the young people had several questions for the panelists, and they agreed that violence is not and must not be a private matter and go unpunished.



## Institute for Youth Development KULT and Bosanska Krupa Youth Council together for the population affected by floods

Although sunny days have arrived, natural disasters from the past period have left behind the problems faced by the citizens of the Una-Sana Canton. The competent services declared that one of the most affected cities was Bosanska Krupa. The Bosanska Krupa civil protection headquarters made a Decision on the declaration of a state of natural disaster. Also, according to the reports of the competent services, about 900 households and 250 buildings were completely isolated and could only be reached by boats.

The damage caused by this natural disaster is extremely large.

In order to help the vulnerable population, the Institute for Youth Development KULT in cooperation with the Youth Council of Bosanska Krupa in the following period will provide support to the most vulnerable categories of the population such as the old and infirm who potentially do not have family support these days, as well as to young people and children. so that they can return to their daily activities as soon as possible. The activities will bring together as many young volunteers as possible who will contribute to people from flooded areas having a better and better quality of life during the period of damage restoration.



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Young volunteers will prepare and distribute packages with food and personal hygiene products for about 200 vulnerable households, visit schools and hand out packages with school supplies to students, and help in the repair of damage in the form of cleaning mud and sand, filling the yard and other activities that are shown as needed in certain areas. Assistance to the population includes the provision of devices for drying moisture after the water recedes, and the devices will be used as needed and moved from household to household. The Institute for Youth Development KULT recognized the importance of supporting citizens in need and allocated KM 10,000 to the Bosanska Krupa Youth Council, which will implement these activities.

Volunteers from other cities in the area of Una-Sana canton can join the activities, and the visit and stay of volunteers in other cities is planned, in order to carry out the activities as well as possible and provide support to those who need it most in this period.



## EU dialogue of young politicians - Concrete initiatives to contribute to EU priorities for BiH

Through four generations of training Learn, think and act! for youth political leaders (UMiDp) conducted by the Institute for Youth Development KULT, over 80 young people from over 15 different parties passed. The event EU dialogue of young politicians in Bosnia and Herzegovina brought together young politicians from over 12 parties, who had already attended the Learn, Think and Act training! for youth political leaders who are ready to work independently or in a group on initiatives for the implementation of EU priorities in BiH, and for a better position of young people in BiH. All participants had the opportunity to get more information about the EU's priorities for BiH and propose initiatives they can work on in the following period. The proposed initiatives will potentially be supported by the Institute for Youth Development KULT, as well as other political and social actors.

In addition, young politicians at the event discussed what the status of a candidate country means in practice for BiH and what the 14 priorities of the EU mean for BiH. Through work in groups and group discussions, young politicians analyzed the current situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina, researched which of the priorities is the most important to them as young politicians and why, and how to start an initiative to implement one of the priorities.

The Institute for Youth Development KULT continues to support young politicians in the implementation of their ideas for better living conditions for young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

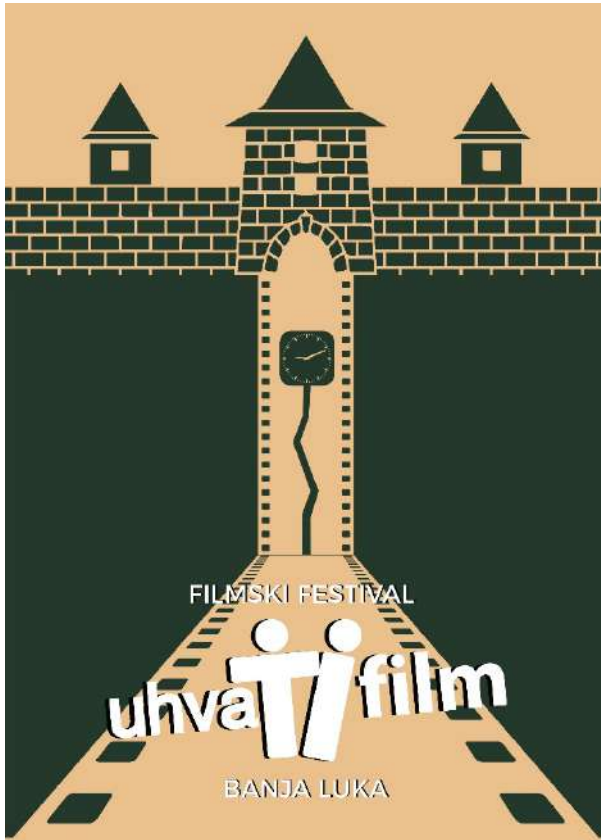




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## „CATCH THE FILM BANJA LUKA” FILM FESTIVAL 2023



The humanitarian organization "Partner" from Banja Luka is organizing the 12th edition of the "Catch the Film Banja Luka" festival, which will take place in October 2023 in Banja Luka. "Uhvati film" is a festival of international character and is realized in Novi Sad, then in Banja Luka, Rijeka and Kotor with the aim of affirming domestic and foreign feature, documentary and animated films, whose actors are persons with disabilities, as well as promoting the opportunities and challenges of persons with disabilities with disabilities (with special reference to multiple marginalized groups) through art.

At the competition for films, which was open for two months, 454 films were submitted, from all over the world. Most films were submitted from Iran and Spain, while 10 films were received from the region. All of them are under consideration by the selector, and then by the expert jury, who will choose the best ones to be shown at the festival in Banja Luka, Novi Sad, Rijeka and Kotor. In addition to the film program, the accompanying "Catch a Film Banja Luka" program of the festival will be International Children's Week in the light of inclusion,

and this activity has an inclusive character, which permeates the entire festival. Then, panel discussions where the panelists will also be people with disabilities who are experts in a certain area about which there is a specific topic, and in this way we affirm the knowledge and experience of people with disabilities and, in any case, their potential.

As part of the festival, the photo exhibition "Culture accessible to everyone" will be presented. On this occasion, on June 5, 2023, a call for works will be announced for all interested individuals and organizations from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and Croatia.

The role of art and culture in society is very important, as is the destruction of prejudices through art. Representations of the experiences of life with disabilities through film art are a significant step towards achieving equal rights, access and relations with society, which is based on ignorance, prejudice and fear. By popularizing various manifestations, projects and activities, the art created by people with disabilities is promoted, and their activism and work contribute to improving their social position, thus motivating other people with disabilities to get involved in all spheres of social life.

The twelfth edition of the "Catch the Film Banja Luka" festival will be held from October 12 to 14, 2023 in Banja Luka.

## 1. Apply for a Silk Road Grant



UNESCO invites young people to apply for the Silk Road Research Grant, which aims to train young researchers to further study the common heritage of the Silk Roads.

**AREA:** religion, language, literature, art, music, economy, trade

**DESCRIPTION:** As part of the ongoing work of the Silk Road Program to better understand the rich history and common heritage and spirit of the Silk Roads, UNESCO, with the support of the

National Commission of the People's Republic of China for UNESCO, launched the "Silk Road Youth Research Grant" in 2021 within the Sector of Social and of humanities. Grant applicants are invited to address areas of academic study related to the common heritage and multiple identities of the Silk Roads, as well as its internal diversity and potential in contemporary societies for creativity, intercultural dialogue, social stability, regional and international cooperation, and ultimately sustainable peace and development. This initiative will award 12 research grants to young people with the best proposals. A wide range of research fields are acceptable, including multidisciplinary and multidimensional proposals that are not limited to one specific region or chronology. The proposed research may cover one or more topics related to the common heritage of the Silk Roads including but not limited to:

Science and technology and traditional knowledge

Religion and spirituality

Language and literature

Art and music

Traditional sports and games

Economy and trade

The legacy of the Silk Roads and contemporary problems and issues

Proposed research must focus on the results of cultural interactions and exchanges, and within a given area must demonstrate specific resulting elements, whether tangible or intangible, that can be identified in two or more cultures along the Silk Roads and beyond.

The panel will award 12 grants of \$10,000 per research project based on the merits of the proposed research and its potential contribution to advancing the understanding of the interactions and exchanges that take place across the Silk Roads and the specific elements that arise from them. The grant will be awarded in two separate instalments. The winners will be announced in October 2023 through an evaluation process carried out by a scientific panel composed of renowned international academics. The proposed research may be conducted by an individual researcher or may be part of a group or collaborative project, however only one grant will be awarded per research project.

**TERMS:** All postgraduate researchers from all countries aged 35 and under at the time of application are eligible to apply.

**With the presentation of animated theater etiquette for children and adults, author and director Marko Dukić, in the Church House in Kalinovik, on May 31 starting at 12:55 p.m., Nevid Theater continues this year's implementation of the educational program "Children learn with Nevid Theater".**

In addition to the presentation of [animated theater etiquette for children and adults](#) produced by Nevid Theater, the educational program also includes the performance of the interactive educational play „[Wonderful Continents](#)“ intended for ages three to 10, as well as the realization of an educational quiz about the rules of good behavior in the theater, continents and life on Earth. Admission to all events is free, and the program in each municipality starts at 12:55 p.m.



As part of the program, Nevid Teatro's digital content will be promoted, namely: an illustrated book on proper nutrition „ [Healthy entertainer of Nevid Theater](#) “, instructive-educational methods in working with children „[Education through play](#)“, [illustrated book of fairy tales and fables for children](#), [audio book](#), as well as the version of the [audio books for children with developmental disabilities](#).

In addition to Kalinovik, children will also have the opportunity to watch the educational program in Čajnič (JU Dom kulture "Filip Višnjić", June 1), Rogatica (JU Center for Culture and Sports "Radenko Mišević", June 2), Vlasenica (JU " Cultural Center", June 12), Šekovići (JU House of Culture "Vladika Nikolaj", June 13), Osmac (House of Culture, June 14) and Petrov (JU "Cultural-Tourist and Sports Center", June 15) .

As part of the project, this year we also visited Donji Žabar (Sports Hall, April 3), Pelagićevo (Administrative-Cultural Center, April 4) and Šamac (JU "Cultural Center" Šamac, April 5), and until at the end of the year, we will also visit eight suburban settlements in Banja Luka.

This program is an integral part of the strategic project of Nevid Theater (2017–2023), whose overall goal is the development and education of the audience from the earliest childhood, as well as the improvement of the knowledge of professional staff about the values and importance of lifelong learning and interactive education in 30 municipalities of the Republic of Srpska and 20 in Banja Luka. suburban settlements.

Since December 2017, it has been implemented in 20 municipalities of Republika Srpska, as well as in 12 Banja Luka suburbs. In addition to 32 performances of the play, 25 lectures were organized on the topic "The influence of interactive performances and drama workshops in the development of physical, cognitive and social skills in children", as well as 50 drama workshops for children. Almost 4,000 children participated in the program, as well as 300 teachers and pedagogues.

The project is co-financed by the Ministry of Education and Culture of the Republic of Srpska and the City of Banja Luka.
