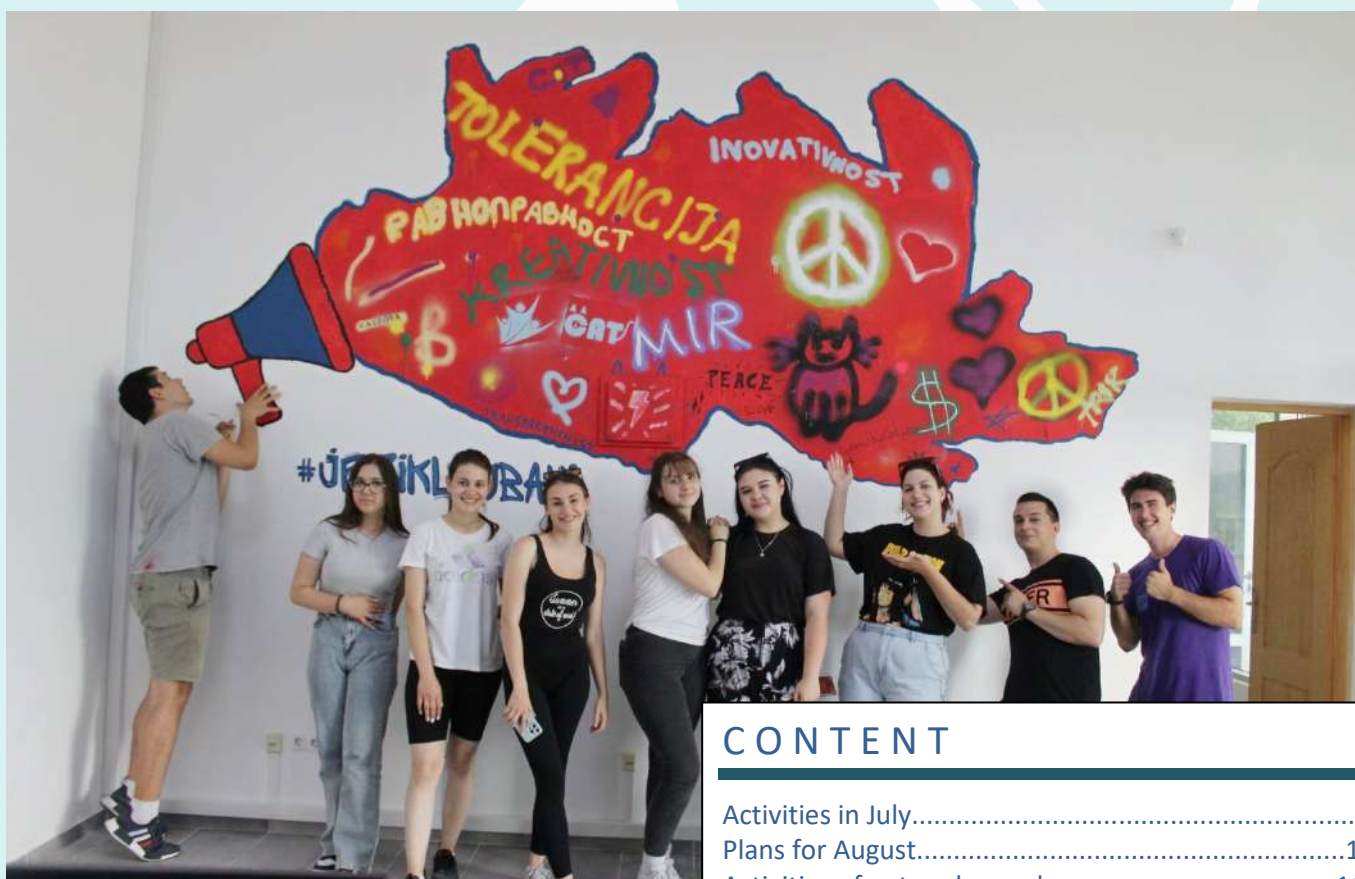

Building equality - with and for adolescent girls

On July 4 and 5, 2023, a two-day workshop was held in Sarajevo for civil society organizations engaged in the implementation of UNICEF's strategy for adolescent girls 2023 - 2025. The workshop was organized so that partners and representatives of youth-led organizations could share experiences from of their existing initiatives, and were informed about UNICEF's existing priorities regarding the participation of adolescent girls and boys in programs that directly affect them. Our work and experience were presented on the second day by **Mirela Biković** and **Suzana Dušanić**.

Conference "Step by step to better policies towards young people in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina"

The Youth Council of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina is 10.7.2023. held the conference "Step by step to better youth policies in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina", which was implemented as part of the **G(a)rant youth project**, with the support of the Institute for Youth Development KULT.



The conference brought together representatives of legislative and executive institutions at the cantonal and federal levels, as well as young people throughout the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, among whom was our **Ammar Grabić**.

After the presentation of the Preliminary Analysis of Conclusions and Recommendations, which established that the majority of Conclusions and Recommendations are pending, emphasizing that the Federal Ministry of Agriculture is the only ministry that has fully implemented the Conclusion related to: "The Federal Ministry of Agriculture and the Federal Ministry of Environment and Tourism are indebted to allocate more funds for projects in the field of agriculture and tourism as a significant potential for entrepreneurship and employment, and to develop programs of promotion and necessary education" While Herzegovina - Neretva Canton fully fulfilled the Conclusion related to: "It is proposed to the assemblies of Central Bosnia Canton, Herzegovina - Neretva Canton, Bosnia and Herzegovina Canton, Posavina Canton, West Herzegovina Canton and Canton 10 to create and adopt a strategy for young people in accordance with the current provisions of the Law on Youth of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the competences of the cantons.", and thus the Strategy for Youth in April 2023 for the period 2023-2028 and the action plan for 2023.



NATO Public Forum, Vilnius

Director of the Youth Resource Center Tuzla, **Miralem Tursinović** was the only representative of the non-governmental sector from BiH at the recently held NATO Public Forum in Vilnius, Lithuania.

NATO Heads of State and Government met at the NATO Summit on July 11-12 in Vilnius, Lithuania, to discuss the current security environment. On this occasion, a NATO public forum was organized, in which

great interest was shown by all countries from the region. The only non-governmental organization from Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as countries in the region, that was invited to participate in the form is the Youth Resource Center from Tuzla.



The goal of the public NATO forum is a better understanding of NATO's policy and goals through dialogue and engagement with a diverse group of interested parties, from heads of state, representatives of governments and ministries to international security experts, opinion makers, academics, young people, journalists in a series of panel discussions, debates and interactive sessions on various topics on NATO's agenda.

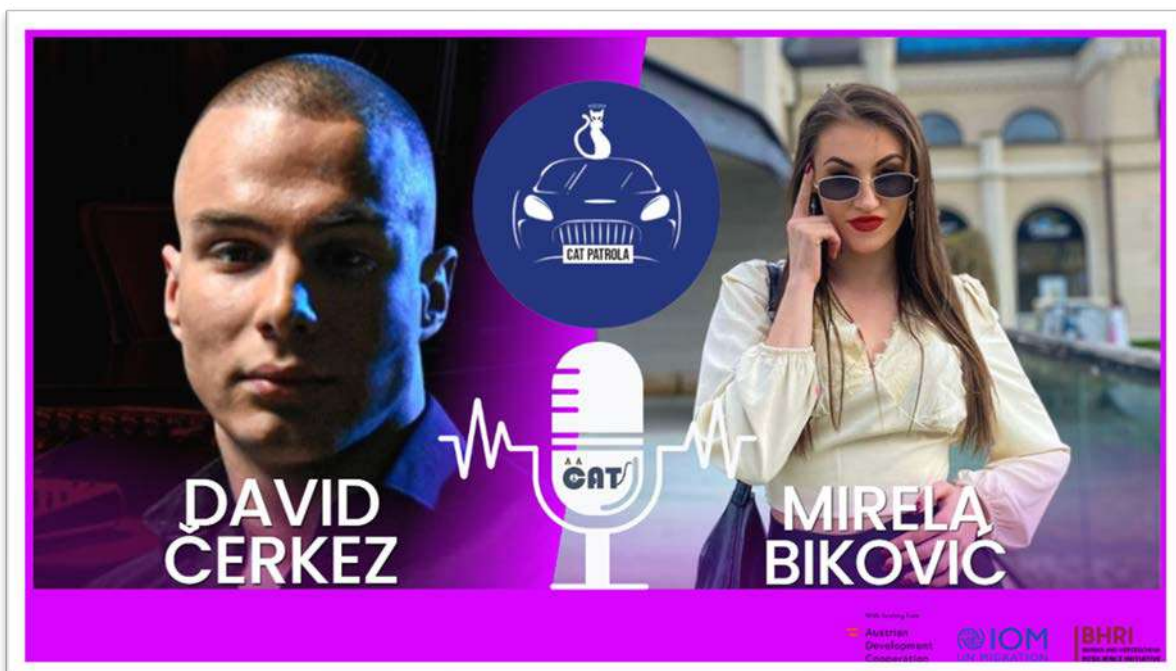

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Opened CoderDojo programming school for young people at the INPUT Youth Center

On 13.07.2023. in the INPUT Youth Center, the first class of the Coder Dojo programming school was held in cooperation with the Bit Alliance and the INPUT Youth Center for the third time in the City of Zenica in the premises of the INPUT Youth Center, as part of the "Summer at the INPUT Youth Center" .



We started in 2018 with the first generation and in 2019 with the second generation, which was followed by a break due to the pandemic from 2020. But now the moment has come to start this excellent project again in cooperation with the Bit Alliance for both children and young people as well as students of technical faculty, who will conduct the training. In addition to acquiring new knowledge, the goal of this project is to introduce students to the opportunities offered by the IT business sector and to motivate them to use every opportunity to learn and improve their IT skills. A significant fact is the fact that the majority of participants declared that they will continue to acquire knowledge in the field of information technology in the future. Said Adi Salčinović, professor, coordinator of the CoderDojo programming school for the City of Zenica and president of the INPUT Youth Center from Zenica.

Mr. Damir Maglajlić, executive director of Bit Alliance, also addressed the participants, emphasizing how important IT education is, and how much only IT experts are in demand.

This is an exceptional project and we are especially grateful to the INPUT Youth Center, which really cares about the affirmation, engagement and education of young people, as well as us Software Engineering students, who gave us the opportunity to do an internship at the INPUT Center and gave us already knowledge in the field IT and education so that we too will be able to transfer our knowledge to the younger population. -Statement of the students who will lead the training.

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UMiD Alumni: Memories do not fade even after several years

The first gathering of Learn, Think and Act! was organized in Sarajevo. UMiD Alumni Community. One gloomy weekend in Sarajevo, the memories of the one-year UMiD experience, carefully preserved for years and even decades, which the participants of earlier generations most often describe as a year of fun, positive stories, good atmosphere, great young people and a lot of new knowledge, were brought to light. Young people who undergo this training are often of the opinion that participating in the training will change their lives.

Keeping in mind that the need to establish an Alumni community has been mentioned among the participants for a long time, the idea of the gathering and the first meeting was precisely to lay the first foundations for the stable operation of the UMiD Alumni together with those present. At the meeting, the key reasons for the establishment of this community were presented, and the methods of its operation, structure and next steps



necessary for active operation were discussed. The idea of the UMiD Alumni community is to create a network of empowered people, professionals in various fields, who want to support and create new opportunities for young people who are currently undergoing or will undergo UMiD training in the future from their current roles.

From 2005 to today, over 400 participants have attended UMiD training through the 17th generation. Today, people who have completed the training are in various countries around the world, as well as in very important positions within Bosnia and Herzegovina. The profiles of participants from earlier generations are very diverse, so that we have participants who are journalists, politicians, elected officials, prominent youth workers, entrepreneurs, social workers, psychologists, athletes, doctors, etc.

The Institute for Youth Development KULT is proud that UMiD memories do not fade because the participants are bound by the same values, regardless of whether they graduated from UMiD a year ago or seventeen years ago. Successfully completed 1st Convention on work with young people - What's next?

The first Convention on work with young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina resulted in numerous recommendations and conclusions that express the views of the majority of participants with the aim of sending a message to all actors, especially decision makers and the public, about the importance of working with young people, the importance of recognizing all actors, and including BiH in current programs in the region and Europe.

Although the youth sector of BiH follows European programs, activities and the Bonn process, its implementation in BiH has not yet adequately begun, and a large part of European programs for youth in BiH is only partially implemented. The event brought together all those who want their voice to be heard, with the aim of updating important issues related to the youth sector and enabling new partnerships, acquaintances and joint initiatives.

In the month of September, there will also be a 'follow up' event, where the participants will meet again in a slightly different way, to discuss the application of the useful tips they took from this event, and to find additional space for support and improvement of their work.



Discussing possible improvements when it comes to work with young people, the participants divided into several groups gave recommendations and conclusions, which will be worked on in the following period. The participants dedicated recommendations and conclusions to the wider community (media, academic community, religious communities, researchers dealing with youth issues and the for-profit sector), government institutions and decision-makers, the youth sector and young people. The first convention on youth in Bosnia and Herzegovina was organized by **the Institute for Youth Development KULT** with the support of **the Embassy of Sweden in Bosnia and Herzegovina**.



Coffee with Jan Waltmans - about the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the fight against corruption

The fight against corruption and the political situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina were the focus of the event "**Coffee with the Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands H.E. Jan Waltmans**", and the event was also attended by participants of the **Institute's training "Learn, think and act" (UMiD)**.

The ambassador referred to the experience of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in the fight against corruption and pointed out the harmful impact that corruption has on the future and perspective of young people in BiH, and he also cited examples of the presence of corruption in all areas of life. The event also discussed the current political situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and young people were particularly interested in the activities of the international community in our country and the steps that should be taken to improve the situation. The role and importance of young people on BiH's path to the European Union was particularly emphasized, and it was concluded that informed, educated and active young people are the most important for changing society and the political situation in the country.



At this "Coffee with...", young people showed a great interest in the discussion about corruption, but also about the diplomatic activities of the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the proof of this was the numerous questions addressed to the ambassador. The ambassador pointed out that it is important to gather young people and talk with them, so that through the daily exchange of information they learn about corruption and are motivated to act.

This event is part of the activities within the **Say NO to Corruption initiative in Sarajevo Canton**, which is implemented by **the Institute for Youth Development KULT**. The initiative is implemented with the support of **the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands**, and seeks to attract the attention of the public, point out the harmful effects of corruption on the lives of individuals, examine the views of citizens and young people on corruption, and provide basic information on the fight against corruption.



YOUTH ORGANIZATION "SVITAC"

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Daily workshops

The youth organization Svitac continued with its daily interactive and online activities. Younger participants did age-appropriate creative and educational activities with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they discussed land animals, snails, rodents and reptiles; they made them thematically from paper, cardboard and decorative material. The youngest participants enjoyed the creative part and modeling bouquets of flowers, dragonflies, dinosaurs and rainbows. The group continued with music workshops, practicing rhythms and a song about caterpillars. Participants continued to learn and write numbers; this month they learned to write numbers 5-8. They did warm-up exercises and yoga for children, and every Thursday they danced, played sports and practiced reading and listening to stories. The goal of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.



Ages 13+ participated in discussions/workshops on: marginalization, discrimination, cultural diversity, concept of beauty and favorite books. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, where they can express their opinion.

At the English and German workshops, they learned the use of split and modal verbs, interrogative sentences, the basics of declension of adjectives, vocabulary of new words related to summer and holidays, wrote dictations, read and translated short texts and phrases, worked on practicing everyday communication and grammar, learned new vocabulary, and worked on interesting presentations and projects.



Guitar workshops

The participants of the guitar workshops continued to work on prepared exercises, techniques, etudes, compositions, improvisation and songs.



Samba workshops

The group worked on three new ideas: "Advocado", "Feedback" and "Partido Alto".

The continuation of all activities of the Youth Organization Svitac is planned for August.

1. Applications are open for the fourth School of Political Activism!

The youth movement Revolt invites young men and women activists from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina to join the Summer School of Political Activism, a seven-day education aimed at raising the level of political literacy of young people and encouraging young people to actively participate in decision-making processes, which will be held in the period 11-17 September in Tuzla.

The call is open to everyone who meets the following conditions:

- Young person (17-30) from Bosnia and Herzegovina
- The possibility of mandatory attendance at 80% of lectures within the School
- Openness to active work and carrying out tasks that will be an integral part of the School's program.

During the seven-day program, education will cover various topics:

- civil society and civic courage
- political science, compass and ideologies
- media in democracy
- elections and electoral process
- political literacy
- green and environmental policies
- political economy.

All topics will be presented by experienced individuals and experts - professors, analysts, long-term activists - giving concrete insight into the most important aspects and practical application of each topic.

2. A total of 300,000 euros for civil society in the Western Balkans



RYConnecting You(th): Open call for project proposals for CSOs (Tirana, July 10, 2023) – Good news is coming from Tirana for civil society organizations (CSOs) in the Western Balkans. The Regional Office for Youth Cooperation (RYCO) launched a new open call for project proposals for CSOs, called "RYConnecting You(th)". This is the fifth time that RYCO has organized an Open Call for CSOs in the region in the last seven years.

The RYConnecting You(th) Open Call has two main thematic areas: Peacebuilding and Reconciliation and Youth Empowerment and Social Engagement. The overall goal is to support civil society in the Western Balkans to encourage reconciliation, peace building, regional cooperation and intercultural learning by providing young people with opportunities that create space for dialogue, mutual learning and greater understanding across the region.

The total financial envelope for this call is 300,000 euros, while the size of the grants is between a minimum of 15,000 euros and a maximum of 30,000 euros. The right to apply is for non-profit CSOs, established in the Western Balkans 6 (WB6): Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia, which exist at least one year before the launch of this call for proposals.

RYCO recognizes the added value of collaborators who can support the partnership in further achieving the goals and outcomes of their projects, so that CSOs can partner with the following collaborators from WB6: cultural institutions (private and public), sports associations and organizations in the field of sports, trade unions, educational institutions such as universities and institutes (public and private), informal youth groups with proven experience in working with and for young people.

RYCO is an intergovernmental organization that deals with peace building, reconciliation and cooperation in the region through youth exchange programs. It was established by the WB6 governments in July 2016 as part of the Berlin Process. RYCO's program focuses on creating opportunities for young people to engage in activities that build mutual understanding and reconciliation in the civic, social, educational, cultural and sporting domains. RYCO initiates and participates in policy making and advocates for reform. It supports the development of a political and social environment that empowers and facilitates youth exchange.

* This designation does not prejudice positions on status and is in accordance with United Nations Security Council Resolution 1244 and the Opinion of the International Court of Justice on the Declaration of Independence of Kosovo.
