### **Final event YInfoPioneers**



We decided to mark the beginning of the new year 2024 by presenting the results of the successfully completed **YinfoPioneers** project, whose activities you have read about in the previous months. action plans that they plan to implement in their local community, Prnjavor.





#### Meeting of members of the ALF Network Slovenia

In Ljubljana, Slovenia, on January 23, 2024, organized by the main office of the Slovenian network ALF - Institute "POVOD" Ptuj, an annual meeting of members of ALF Slovenia was held. The meeting was also attended by Miralem Tursinović coordinator of ALF BiH. During the meeting, members of ALF Slovenia were introduced to the activities of the Bosnia and Herzegovina ALF Network, and discussed the possible development and directions of cooperation between BiH and Slovenian organizations. One of the topics, but also the



possibilities of cooperation, was the upcoming call "ALF in motion", cooperation and exchange between ALF member organizations from Europe and the Mediterranean.







# Final meeting of partners of the Yinfopioneers project – Ljubljana, 24th–25th, January 2024

In Ljubljana, Slovenia, in the period from 24 to 25 January 2024, the final meeting of partners in the project "YinfoPioneers" was organized. The meeting was an opportunity to partner in a twoyear project: ERYICA European Youth Information and Counselling Agency, PORAKA NOVA, North Macedonia, Forum MNE Montenegro, CEREBRA Banja Luka and ORC Tuzla, Bih, ŠKUC Slovenia, YNO Albania and Catalan Youth Agency Barcelona. The meeting summarized the results and activities of the project: Local meetings with young people, government representatives and other stakeholders, development of strategies for the development and coordination of youth info centers in the Balkans, delivered trainings, and other administrative issues. At the meeting, it was agreed that the members of the consortium continue to cooperate even after the expiration of the project, as well as to continue with the exchange of all information concerning young people in the Balkans (conferences, workshops, exchanges, jobs ...).



In Ljubljana, partners also had the opportunity to

study visit organizations and associations of citizens engaged in the same or similar activities. Within this we visited: **DrogArt Association** – a private, non-profit and volunteer association that deals with the reduction of harmful effects that drugs and alcohol have among young people; **Info Centre ŠKUC** (Študentski kulturni centar) – one of the leading Slovenian NGOs engaged in the promotion of cultural and artistic activities in Slovenia; Representative of **the Youth Office of the City of Ljubljana** and representatives of **the Youth Council of Slovenia**; **Association Legebitra** – LGBTIQ+ non-governmental organization dealing with the protection of human rights, education, mental, mental and sexual health and advocacy of social and systematic changes in Slovenia.







#### ORC AND HCA TUZLA REGULAR ACTIVITIES

During January, we worked on maintaining and developing communications and coordination within the Youth Network of Bosnia and Herzegovina (www.orctuzla.ba). 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Inclusion of young people through sports bridges: Project of the Association 'Dijamant' from Jajce and 'Centre for Rural Development – SEE'









#### SPORTSKI MOSTOVI ZA INKLUZIJU MLADIH

Within the project "Sports Bridges for Youth Inclusion", the Association "Dijamant" from Jajce, joins forces with the partner organization "Centre for Rural Development – SEE" from Struga, North Macedonia. The project is supported by the Regional Youth Cooperation Office (RYCO). Tirana-Albania.

This project aims to bring together young people from different countries through sports activities and educational initiatives, in order to promote social inclusion, diversity and international friendship. Young people from both associations will connect through online sessions to get to know each other, exchange information about their interests and form teams to work together.



Young people will prepare for sports activities through online and offline training. Online platforms will allow them to share video training and exercises, so that everyone is involved, regardless of location.



Online workshops will connect sports activities with discussions and projects, where young people will work together on topics that promote inclusion, tolerance and diversity. The project also includes workshops on entrepreneurship, promoting also the importance of creative writing.

In addition to sports activities, the project will provide young people with education on a healthy lifestyle and physical activity. The organization of a sports tournament in volleyball and indoor football will include teams composed of young people from both countries, with the aim of emphasizing international friendship and sports cooperation. Young people will also have the opportunity to learn about different cultures and traditions, which will enable a better understanding of diversity and strengthening links among young people. During the activities of sports meetings, young people from Macedonia will visit Jajce-BiH, which will further strengthen international cooperation and understanding.

These young people often face additional obstacles in realizing their potential and achieving social inclusion. Limited access to education, employment, cultural content and activities can lead to feelings of exclusion and insufficient support. Their opportunities to develop skills, create positive experiences and establish mutual connections are often limited.

The project implementation team organized one in a series of planned activities - a one-day training on the topic of entrepreneurship, with a focus on acquiring basic knowledge and skills of writing project proposals / business plan for young people

Through dynamic activities and practical exercises, participants have acquired basic knowledge and skills that will benefit them in the future. Special emphasis was placed on teamwork, creativity and problem solving, and the results were outstanding. We saw how our students not only acquired new knowledge, but also developed confidence and enthusiasm for further learning. This project would not have been possible without the support of our lecturers, mentors and sponsors, who have invested their time and resources to provide the best experience for our students. We would like to thank them for their dedication and support throughout the project. We proudly look back on the achievements of our students and look forward to future initiatives that will advance education in our common area. ## Local Youth Services in Zenica-Doboj Canton



In December 2023, YOUTH CENTER INPUT successfully completed the implementation of the project "Local Youth Services", which aimed to establish communication with young people (leaders) and municipal and city authorities in Zenica-Doboj Canton (Zenica, Visoko and Zavidovići) and 9 municipalities (Breza, Doboj-Jug, Kakanj, Maglaj, Olovo, Tešanj, Usora, Vareš and Žepče), with young people (leaders) and municipal and city authorities, i.e. officials operating in municipalities and cities for youth issues.

In the first part of the project "Local Youth Services", representatives of the Youth Center INPUT visited 12 municipalities and cities and talked with mayors, mayors and youth officials about the situation and activities of young people in their municipalities, cities, as well as connectivity and communication of young people and officials and assistance from municipal and city authorities. The situation on the ground was different in some municipalities, cities have very nice communication and conditions for young people, and in some not from the side of officials or from the side of young people.

After the visits and promotion of the project "Local Youth Services" as well as calls for training for youth leaders in the community.

Training was also held for 15 young people from 12 local communities where they had the opportunity to learn about youth work, activism, volunteerism, how to be a youth leader, key techniques of youth work, motivation and starting young people towards activism, and the last day of training writing and managing the project cycle. Through training, young people developed their skills through practical examples and tasks with the advice and instructions of experts in the field of youth work, who shared their rich experience in working with



young people and encouraged our participants to further develop in this direction. Through practical simulation, young people had the opportunity to show themselves as future leaders of their communities, and try to propose a solution to the problems they have noticed or faced in their environment and society. They had the opportunity to acquire basic knowledge in writing and managing the project cycle, and how to present this project to their society and prove that they are the ones who are capable of making changes.

The project is supported by the Federal Ministry of Culture and Sports and the Ministry of Education, Science, Culture and Sports of Zenica-Doboj Canton.



## A combination of knowledge and humanity

In the Youth Center INPUT was held education for young people in the field of Web development within the program INPUT academy., web development course. Through a comprehensive course, participants had the opportunity to learn the basics of HTML, CSS, JavaScript, and learn how to efficiently place their work on the GitHub platform.

The training, which lasted from December 2023 to January 2024, was a challenging adventure for all participants. During this period, the participants showed exceptional dedication and inexhaustible energy in learning and work. Their motivation and desire to improve were key factors that contributed to the successful completion of the course.

Under the mentorship of young and inspiring lecturer **Amer Alić**, the participants not only mastered the techniques of web development, but also developed creativity and the ability to work independently. Amer Alić was not the only educator in the course - the participants had the opportunity to hear the experiences of other experts in the field.

Guest lecturers, including **Adin Jahić**, software engineer, Prof. Dr. **Bakir Čičak, Alan Avdić**, software engineer and **Adi Salčinović**, MA, contributed to the diversity of the Web development course. Their expertise and practical experience have enriched the lectures, providing participants with additional perspectives and a deeper understanding of the complexities of web programming.

At the last class, the trainees presented their projects, applying the acquired knowledge in a creative and functional way. After successful presentations, they were presented with certificates of successfully completing the Web development course, which represented not only a reward for their efforts, but also a confirmation of acquired skills.

This education was not only an opportunity to acquire IT knowledge in the field of Web development, but also showed humane young people who, by sucking up to participate in the course, i.e. donated funds for the Merhamet Zenica Ro for the soup kitchen. Students' commitment to learning and enthusiasm are a shining example of how selected education can transform individuals into experts ready for the challenges of modern web technologies.

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# Young leaders in the community: love of cycling launched the 'aj na bajk' initiative

Thanks to the sense of responsibility towards the community and leadership skills she acquired through the learn, think and act! training, Sevda Muratović from Velika Kladuša decided to take concrete steps to motivate fellow citizens, especially young people, to love cycling and make it an integral part of her life through the local civic initiative 'aj na bajk.

Sevda has organized a series of activities that promote cycling as a healthy and fun activity, but also education for the community about the importance of healthy eating and regular physical activity. Education provided insight into the importance of proper nutrition and regular physical activity, highlighting the benefits that cycling can bring in maintaining a healthy lifestyle. Participants had the opportunity to hear first-hand the experience of a professional athlete, getting the motivation to introduce healthy habits into their lives.



Another key activity of the initiative was an interactive class for children in which the focus was placed on the importance of physical activity and proper nutrition, and included exercises and a short mobility competition where the little ones could receive prizes. Through play and education, children have created awareness of the importance of active life, developing a love for healthy habits at an early age.

The Institute for Youth Development KULT has developed the concept of Job shadowing that will provide civil society organizations in Bosnia and Herzegovina with a new perspective on organizational development. In the year that is behind us, visits have proven to be very useful, and partner organizations often decide in

their work to start applying what they learned in visiting the Institute.

#### Public call for basic training of youth officers in BiH

The Institute for Youth Development KULT announces the Public Call for Basic Training of Youth Officers, which will be open until April 10, 2024.

The full text of the public call for the FBiH can be downloaded <u>HERE</u> And for RS <u>HERE</u>. The application form for both calls can be downloaded HERE.

Note: An official from the Brčko District of BiH can use both entity calls, and the Law on Youth of Brčko District of BiH will be equally represented during training as entity laws dealing with youth issues.



The purpose of training of officers is to enable the participants to independently perform the duties of youth officers by obtaining a certificate of knowledge on youth policy and youth work, and that persons who in the civil service perform or intend to perform the function and duties of officers are professionally trained for youth work with the possession of professional competences and certificates necessary for the performance of this position in a civil service body.

The training runs from **May to December 2024**, including the final exam. The awarding of certificates to successful trainees is planned upon completion of the training in December 2024.

Civil servants working with young people at the municipal, city and cantonal levels and other interested persons over the age of 18 with at least a secondary education can apply to the public call.

All necessary documentation should be received **no later than April 10, 2024** by mail or in person at the address of the Institute for Youth Development KULT. Applications that do not arrive by the specified deadline will not be considered.

#### **YOUTH ORGANIZATION "SVITAC"**

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## Daily workshops

The youth organization Svitac continued with daily interactive and online activities. The younger participants did creative and ageappropriate educational things, with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they continued with various themes: ancient Greece, the culture of Egypt, geometric shapes, New Year's holidays, winter holidays. The youngest participants enjoyed the creative part and modeling fun objects holiday decorations, various animals they made from paper). The group continued with music workshops,



rehearsing rhythms and songs. Participants continued to learn Latin by practicing writing the letters C, Ć, D, Đ and Dž. They did warm-up exercises and yoga for the kids, and every Thursday they danced, played sports, and practiced attention and concentration reading and listening to stories. At the workshops of English, German and Turkish, they learned words related to household, everyday life, weather and holidays. The aim of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express



their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.

Age 13+ participated in discussions/workshops on the topics: human rights, peace, freedom, climate change and volunteering. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, in which they can speak their minds.

In English and German workshops they worked on practicing grammar and everyday communication, reading and translating short texts and phrases, school homework and interesting projects.



# Guitar workshops

Participants continued to rehearse scales, arpeggios, chords and cadences in multiple tonalities and bass lines in different genres.



# Samba workshops

The group continued to work on a new musical idea. Jazzy melody in D minor under the working title "Improvisation 1". They also rehearsed compositions from the past period.



Participants continued to rehearse their own composition called "Elephant", including the introduction, ending, and main theme using q&a techniques.



#### **International Day of Education**



International Education Day celebrated on January 24 th around the world under the auspices of UNESCO. This day is a symbol of strengthening the role that education plays in creating development global peace, progress. Youth organization Svitac marked the International Day Education with participants up to seven years of age in an educational and creative workshop. In the first part, we talked about the importance education. In the creative part, the participants together with the

volunteers made a large format book as a symbol of learning, and in it they drew how they see themselves in school. The workshop was held in the premises of the Youth Center of Brcko District.

For February, the continuation of all activities of the Youth Organization Svitac is planned.





## **INFORMATION / ANNOUNCEMENTS / DONORS / CALLS**

#### 1. Virtual exchanges - ONAuBiH

The Youth News Association in Bosnia and Herzegovina (ONAuBiH), together with the associations Institute for Media and Diversity - Western Balkans (Serbia), Forum Youth and Informal Education (FORUM MNE) from Montenegro and Mladinski Obrazoven Forum (YEF) from North Macedonia within the project Youth in Western Balkans – A Virtual Postcard will conduct online virtual exchanges in the next two years.

Virtual exchanges will be led by trainers who have undergone training in the previous months. These virtual exchanges are intended for high school students and students aged 15 to 25. The topic of intercultural dialogue will be covered through a conversation about everything that affects it: stereotypes and prejudices, hate speech, communication, social networks, media literacy. Each virtual exchange will last 3 to 4 hours, while the working language in which they are performed is English, as it involves young people from four countries of the Western Balkans – Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia.

Registration will be possible via THE YOUNG calendar available <a href="here">here</a> (<a href="mailto:MyApp">MyApp</a> (<a href="mailto:mladicalendar.com">mladicalendar.com</a>). It is necessary for interested high school students to register, and registration is very easy: it is necessary to enter their e-mail, name and surname, mobile phone number, password and to mark the country from which they come. Note: Passwords must contain at least 1 lowercase letter [a-z], minimum 1 capital letter [A-Z], minimum 1 numeric character [0-9] and minimum 1 special character: -\_\_@+. After that, they will be able to apply to the YOUNG calendar and choose the date they want.

The terms are divided into exchanges intended for high school students and exchanges intended for students, because the content of the exchanges will vary depending on who they are intended for. It is important that they choose the term they want and the coach with whom they will attend virtual exchanges. Currently, the calendar includes dates for holding virtual exchanges in february and march, and this activity will be carried out in the coming months.

In addition, we are preparing many **valuable prizes.** The most active and successful exchange participants will have the opportunity to meet in person (in one of the four countries participating in the exchanges) and receive the support of the project team to jointly produce multimedia content dealing with the topic of intercultural dialogue.
